"I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to live in harmony in the Lord." (4:2)

#### 4. See people serve Christ.

"Indeed true companion, I ask you also to help these women, who have shared my struggle in the cause of the gospel, together with Clement also and the rest of my fellow workers..." (4:3)

#### 5. See people <u>rejoice</u> in Christ.

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!" (4:4)

#### **Application:**

- 1. If you want to increase your "joy quotient," based on this passage, what do you need to focus on this week?
- 2. What tends to rob you of your joy? This week, pray for a new perspective of His joy to be at work in your life.

## Bible Study Questions/ Discussion "The Joy of Knowing Jesus" Philippians 4:1-4 Oct. 9, 2011

- 1. This past week, what brought you "joy?" What robbed you of "joy?" When you hear the command "Rejoice in the Lord always" what do you feel? (Unrealistic? Impossible? Try harder?)
- 2. When you become a Christian what does the Lord promise concerning our circumstances? (John 16:33; Acts 14:22; 2 Tim. 3:12)
- 3. This week we will study how this kind of joy can be possible. (Read Phil. 4:1-4) First Paul shared that his joy came from people who came to Christ. (4:1) (Also I Thess. 2:19) Share some examples of someone you know or someone at the recent baptism service that really blessed you when you saw them come to Christ.
- 4. Discuss how special it is to have your name written in the Lamb's Book of Life. (4:3) (Also Rev. 13:8; 21:27) What response should there be with this realization? (Lk. 10:20; 16:10)
- 5. The second way joy comes into our lives is seeing people stand strong in Christ. (Phil. 4:1) Victories against Satan and sin should be celebrated! What specific victories have you experienced recently? (I Cor. 10:13) Review the different ways we can make sure we will "stand firm in the Lord. (Also Phil. 1:27)

- 6. Read the story of Nehemiah and the people finding the joy of the Lord. What did they need to remember that would bring them joy? (Neh. 8:1-10)
- 7. When Christians live in harmony there is great joy. (Psalm 133:1) (Phil. 4:2) Discuss the application of Spurgeon's quote –"In essentials –unity...In non-essentials –liberty...In all things charity." Review the Biblical principles of unity. (Phil. 2:5; Eph. 4:3, 15; I Peter 3:8)
- 8. Serving Christ brings great joy as well. In Phil. 4:3 what blessed Paul concerning this church? Share a time of ministry that brought joy to your heart.
- 9. Read Phil. 4:4. If rejoicing is to be continuous how does joy come when bad things happen? What kind of problems did Paul face? (I Cor. 4:9-13) When Paul says to "rejoice in the Lord" what does that mean? (John 15:10-11; Isa. 61:10; James 1:2-5; Rom. 8:28)
