

SERMON TEXT

1 Peter 2.9-17; 3.13-17 ESV

1 Peter 2:9-17 9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. 10 Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. 11 Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul. 12 Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.

Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, ¹⁵ but in your hearts regard Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; ¹⁶ yet do it with gentleness and respect, having a good conscience, so that, when you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷ For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil.

News from Bill and Cheryl's travels in early 2020 to Bangladesh

Elizabeth School: Most of you know that the Elizabeth Memorial School is named for our daughter who died in 2004. The school started in 2006 and now has 125 students in 5 grades located in the far north. The people there are illiterate and desperately poor. The Muslim girls, often the best students, get married off when they are 12 or 13. With each grade, the number of girls to boys goes down. An American friend with us was appalled by that fact. All I can say is that Christians are seeing people educated and the gospel is being preached. These Muslims have no hope outside of what Christians are doing in their midst. The situation underscores why the school and associated church are necessary. Before the Elizabeth School opened its doors, there was no Christian presence in this, the poorest and darkest part of Bangladesh. Today, we have the school, church and church plants. I call that progress. It contrasts to the general darkness that surrounds. It brings the light of hope.

Retooling Training: It is a strange year: lots of international travel at the beginning and end. It is a good thing. In addition to attending General Assembly and visiting churches back East, preaching in several, chairing the Bangladesh Partnership, I have to create four new courses from scratch that I will give in Bangladesh and Sri Lanka for four weeks in the fall. If they work out, I will also use them as a model for building a theological curriculum designed specifically for Non-Western audiences. I will let you know later exactly what that means. For now, it is worth saying that Western teaching in non-Western settings often stumbles because of the way we teach. The same thing applies to the work we do now in Montana with Native American Christians. People do not learn the same way. This could be a very important development in boosting the quality of theological education in Asia and Montana The courses I will teach are hermeneutics, Biblical Theology and Systematic Theology in 4-5 weeks, 40 hours per week.
