II. Christ's Sacrifice Need Never Be Repeated (v 11-18)

10/20/2019

v 11 OT sacrifices needed to be repeated Lev 16:11, 33-34

{note: man-made religions also have repetitive sacrifices which can never take away sin}

v 12 this man (Jesus) offered one sacrifice Romans 6:10

sat down - something no OT high priest ever dared to do: Exo 28:31, 33-35

Christ sat down - because his sacrifice accomplished what 1,000's of animal sacrifices couldn't.

v 13 = Psalm 110:1 - which truth is confirmed in Hebrews 1:3

v 14 Those who place their trust in Christ's offering on Calvary's tree are *perfected for* for ever and are sanctified before God's throne (i.e. are set apart from all other earthly 'worshippers'. Furthermore, to be sanctified means to be 'made holy' and, therefore, ready to stand in the presence of a Holy God in his holy heaven).

How do we know personally that we have perfect sanctification before God?

v 15 Because the Holy Ghost is a witness to us.

v 16 = Jeremiah 31:31-33

v 17 = Jeremiah 31:34 also Psalm 103:12 Isaiah 43:25 Hebrews 8:12

v 18 there is no more offering & no more remembrance because there is remission!

III. Christ's Sacrifice Opens the Way to God (v 19-39)

A. The Explanation (v 19-21)

Paul explains the types found in the Temple where the Jews were taught to worship.

The tabernacle veil stood between God and the worshipper.

The veil is a type of his flesh (v 20). { Paul means the flesh of Jesus' (v 19) }

Now that Jesus' body was broken and his blood shed on Calvary's cross,

no veil stands between us and God.

That tabernacle veil covered the *glory of God*, just as Christ's human body covered the *glory of God* within (John 1:14).

No OT Jew could enter into the presence of his God.

When Christ's body was offered, the veil was torn (rent in twain - Mt 27:51).

New Covenant worshippers access to the Holy God:

boldness to enter into the holiest (v 19).

B. The Invitation (v 22-25)

Paul gives three invitations using the phrase 'let us'.

v 22 let us draw near - instead of departing Hebrews 3:12

v 23 let us hold fast ...our faith - not wavering 2 Peter 3:17

v 24 let us consider one another - our faith is not a selfish faith. It is to be shared in the community of believers. That's called *fellowship* 1 John 1:7

"Believers need to come together today. We need to draw together in love and worship our Saviour in a local church.

These three let us verses invite us to :

Draw near in faith - toward God

Draw near in hope - for ourselves

Draw near in charity - with others " J. Vernon McGee

C. The Exhortation (v 26-39)
