The New and Better (Part 2)
(A Review of Hebrew's Theology)
Reading: Hebrews 4:12-16

...pray...

Church consultants like to say every church has a *front door* and a *back door*... did I just hear you say, "well **duh!**"

But seriously, their point is that we want people to *enter* our church's *front door*, join *God's family*, and **never** *exit out* that *back door*!

Hebrews is all about guarding the church's back door against apostasy - desertion.

Spec. desertion brought on by persecution by the 1st c. Romans against Christians.

So Hebrew's writer is *nailing shut* the exit by *pounding in* **two** important truths: **new** & **better**. As in, the **NT** delivers what the **OT** only previewed. As in, Jesus is better than angels or Moses or Aaron. As in, the gospel is better than the Law. As in, grace is better than works.

Three weeks ago we finished our <u>vs by vs</u> exposition of Hebrews (SermonAudio), and this morning we are wrapping up our review of this imp't **NT** exhortation by revisiting...

Four truths that *Hebrews* still teaches Christians in every age.

Last Sunday morning we considered the first two...

- 1. **The** *superiority* of *Jesus*. **7:11-8:2.** Specifically, Jesus is the *new* & *better* & *ultimate* & *eternal* King & High Priest. *Exalted* and *established* at the right hand of throne of the Majesty on High! *Ruling* and *interceding*!
- **2.** The strength of the gospel. 10:11-18 Christ's once for all sacrifice ratified the New Cov, and we can now have a new heart and mind. God made this glorious promise (Jer 31; Heb 8; Heb 10): and their sins and lawless deeds I will remember no more.

This morning, we'll consider two more key truths from Hebrews...

- 3. The severity of drifting. 6:1-8
- 4. The sweetness of assurance. 6:9-12

Hebrews has several warnings about *drifting* away from the truth (or, of letting the truth *drift away* from you!).

- 1. There are **five/six** warning texts scattered throughout Hebrews. **Pt**.: You must take the gospel seriously!
 - a. The warnings are for unbelievers in the church; the man or woman who *sits in the pew* but *won't get off the fence* and *come* to Christ. She still is **not** a Christian. He *listens* but hesitates to repent.
- 2. To begin, **vv.1-3** warn you that the *foundation* is not **the** completed *building*, the *start* is **not** the *finish*; you have to *leave* the start and *press on* to *complete* the task.
 - a. In fact, the writer says it *twice* so you won't ignore him: *leave...press* on... i.) *Leaving* (→ *divorce*) the *elementary principles* (ABCs) about the Christ (Messiah); ii.) *Press* on ... to maturity (completion).
- 3. "But what can be so **bad** about the *elementary teaching about Jesus*!?!"
 - a. Remember that Hebrew's audience had a strong Jewish heritage. These *elementary teachings* (1) are **not** the *gospel* as we would understand it, but **OT** *predictions* & *symbols* of the coming Messiah.
 - i. They were *good & helpful*, but **not** *complete*. They are a *foundation*, but they **aren't** the *completed building*! They might serve as the *starting line*, but **not** the *finish line*!
- **4. VV.1&2** list **six** *teachings* you can find in your **OT** that point towards Jesus. In the context of Hebrews they are **Old** Covenant teachings that *lay a foundation* for the **New** Covenant Savior (but not the *finished structure*).
 - i. *Repentance* from dead works (1) this is a reference to evil deeds that lead to spiritual death. The **OT** warns you to turn from them. But the **NT** offers you a Savior to turn to.
 - ii. *Faith towards God* (1) Yes, the **OT** teaches *faith*! But now the **Gospel** teaches you that *faith* in God **must** mean *faith* in Jesus, alone: *No man comes to the Father except by Me*.

- iii. *Instructions about washings* (2). You might assume this means *believer's baptism*, but *not so*!
 - 1. Jewish tradition did much with *symbolic cleansing* (David, Psa 51: anguished over his *adultery* & wrote: *wash me and I shall be whiter than snow*).
 - 2. The *whole truth* is that the **Gospel** promises you can be *truly* & *permanently washed* by the *blood* of Jesus *thru the washing and renewing by the Holy Spirit* (Titus 3).
- iv. Laying on of hands.
 - 1. The **OT** worshiper *laid his hands* on the annual sacrifice to signifying *identifying* with the sacrifice. And so the *lamb symbolically* carried his sins. *Over & over!*
 - 2. But now, by faith, you *identify* with the *Lamb of God* and your sins are *placed* on Jesus. *Once & for all*!
- v. **Resurrection** from the dead. The **OT** hints at the resurrection but the **NT** shouts resurrection all over the place!
 - 1. Jesus claimed (Jn 11:25): "I am the resurrection & the life! He who believes in Me will live even if he dies."
- vi. *Eternal judgment*. The **OT** indicates, of course, that God judges!
 - 1. But the **details** of *future judgment* are **everywhere** in **NT!** We've read in **9:27** *And inasmuch as it is appointed for man to die once and after this comes judgment*.
- b. Yes, the **OT** points straight to a coming Messiah, and that's a *good start*, but its message is **not** *complete*.
 - i. So Hebrews warns you to *press on to maturity*. To embrace a *full* **New Co**v understanding & acceptance of the gospel. To *turn* to *Jesus* ...

- 5. This text reminds us of **two** theological truths that play into becoming a Christian: your *responsibility* and God's *sovereignty*. *Pressing on* (1) is *your responsibility*. Yet, ultimately, we must acknowledge God's *sovereignty* in every individual's salvation. (**read v.3**)
- 6. Now we come to the *heart* of this warning (4-6): if you *wait too long* there is **no** second chance (2X). Did *that* get your attention!?!
- 7. The warning **isn't** actually articulated until **v.6:** ... it is impossible to renew them again to repentancepause...
 - a. The word "*impossible*" here doesn't mean *difficult* or *really difficult*…it means *impossible*.
 - b. **I.e.**, there comes a point after which the *procrastinator* **won't** *repent* because they **can't** *repent*.
- 8. Is this warning for a *reprobate pagan* the kind of guy who *brags* about **never** *darkening* the *door* of the church...? **No**... this word is for the *woman* or *man* who has been *hanging around* the church & even *hanging out with the saints* for a *long time*!
 - a. Our text gives **five** *identifying marks* of the *unsaved church-goer* who is in danger of *losing his opportunity* to be saved.
 - b. *Once enlightened* (4) They have *heard* the gospel and they *understand* its *promise*, but they **won't** *accept* its *invitation*. The *light* has come, but they still prefer the *dark*.
 - c. *Tasted the heavenly gift* The **NT** teaches that Jesus Christ is God's *indescribable gift*, and *salvation* thru faith in Him is *the gift of God*.
 - d. *Partakers of the Holy Spirit*. The **1**st **c**entury *procrastinator* had witnessed the *Holy Spirit* working *through* the apostles and in the lives of their genuinely Christian friends. But **not** in their own lives...
 - e. Tasted the good word of God. They had sat under faithful gospel preaching week after week.

- f. Tasted the powers of the age to come. The term "powers" here suggests miracles, and "the age to come" is Christ's Coming Kingdom.
- g. Yet despite coming "this close" to the Kingdom, some still refused to come all the way in! After all, Judas Iscariot experienced everything Peter and John did, yet he still snuck off to the Jews....
- 9. But how does this man or woman *crucify* to themselves the Son of God and put Him to open shame?
 - a. The man or woman, young or old, who *hears the gospel*, and *witnesses* its power in their *church* and *family* and *friends*, and yet *still refuses* to *turn to Jesus* is *judging Jesus* and finding Him *wanting*.
 - b. That woman or man is *standing* in that mob and *calling* for Pilate to "*crucify Him!*" He is calling for Christ to be *nailed* again on Golgotha's cross and *mocked* by His enemies.
- 10.I've said that this is a warning that the *procrastinator* can put off Christ for so long that *repentance* is no long possible. His *heart* becomes *too hard*.
- 11.But let's be very clear about what **v.6** *does* **not** mean. ... This serious warning does **not** teach that a genuine Christian can *lose* her salvation.
 - a. The Bible promises (1 Pt 1:5) that a true Christ is *protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.* **Jude** promises that God *keeps you from stumbling.*
- 12. The warning here is that to **refuse** to decide *for* Christ is to decide *against* Him to *stand in judgment* of Him.
 - a. Especially after you've enjoyed all these advantages!
 - b. If you refuse *too often* for *too long*, you will *lose* your opportunity *to turn* to Him ...ever.

- 13. This sobering *warning* ends with a simple *illustration*. Every *crop* needs rain, but *rain alone* is not enough the *rain* is not the *harvest* (**read vv.7-8**).
- 14. What kind of *ground* are you...? This looks like a *streamlined version* of Jesus' "*Parable of the Soils*." Jesus' alluded to it as one of His most important parables. ... "*The sower went out to sow*..."
 - a. The *seed* of the gospel was sown on **four** types of *soils*.
 - b. The *sower* was the same, the *seed* was the same, the *plan* was the same, the *goal* was the same.
 - c. For the most part, the *beginning* looked the same.
 - d. But in the end, the *harvest* wasn't the same...
 - e. The difference was the *soil*.
 - f. Here Hebrews makes the same point....
- 2. The *ground* of **v.7** gets *repeated rain, drinks* it in, and yields *fruit for God*. In return, God *blesses it*.
- 3. The *ground* of **v.8 also** gets *repeated rain, drinks* it in, and yields...only *thorns* & *thistles*. The *harvest* of the *Fall* & the *Curse* (Gen3).
 - a. And, in fact, this ground experiences the *ultimate outcome* of the Fall. The *curse* of *eternal death*.
 - **b.** So sir(ma'am) get on with it!

This is a warning, and here it is: To *stand* at the starting line, to *listen* to the starter's instructions, to *hear* the call of his pistol, and *to just stand there* while the pack pulls away, will never get you to the finish line! And you may never get another chance to get in the race to the Celestial City.

If the warning is troubling, the assurance is sweet! Read 6:9-12

- 1.) It's hard to miss that Hebrew's most *severe warning* is immediately followed by one its most *comforting assurances*. *Assurance* is a big deal in Hebrews! When you *belong* to Jesus, He wants you to *know* it!
 - a. But did that *warning* (1-8) make you *squirm*...? Maybe it makes you *squirm* because you need to *get off* the fence, *leave behind* the elementary things, and *run to* Christ! I.e. *maybe you're not saved*!
 - b. Or maybe you *are* already a Christian. But that *warning* rattles you, *esp.* if you are having *one of those days* when *temptations* seem strong and your *soul* seems weak! ("How could a Christian think what I just thought!?!")
 - c. Our writer *knows* that! So he immediately stops to *comfort* shaken Christians and *re-energize* their assurance.
- 2.) If you read carefully it is clear that he's now turned his attention to the true Christians. They are (9) his beloved ... & God's beloved. This is the only place our writer uses "beloved" in his entire letter, but it appears elsewhere in the **NT**, and is a common term of endearment for Christians!
 - a. And Hebrews is *very clear* of what is *true* of those who are *truly Christians*: *better things* & *salvation things*.
 - i. ? Better than what things ... !?! Better than all the grim issues that betray the spiritually immature & the procrastinator (1-8): They are...
 - 1. Perpetually content w/ the insufficient ABCs of OT, hearing & witnessing the power of the Holy Spirit thru the Gospel yet never committing to Christ, therefore judging & rejecting & condemning Christ by their refusal to follow to Him, growing spiritually harder, bearing a harvest of thorns & thistles (Fall & Curse!), therefore living under the constant threat of God's judgment!
 - 2. But that's *not you*, *beloved*...for *you*, it's so much *better*:

- ii. Your life is a life of salvation things! Your soil is the fruitful soil of **v.7**, and the Holy Spirit's showers of blessing have yielded a gospel harvest, & you live under God's blessing!
- iii. Our writer is *convinced*! → His *grammar* ("convinced") is a Gr. perfect & passive verb (past/continue). These saints' faithful lives have convinced Him over the long haul that they are saved, being sanctified, & on the narrow way to the Cel. City. PAUSE
- b. Then (10) he *drills down a little* into his *convinced assurance*. We have *assurance of salvation* based *first* on God's *character* & then on *our fruit*.
- c. **Read v.10.** Your *assurance* is grounded in God. The Bible praises *all* God's glorious *character* & *works* from the first page to the last, but our text draws on these **two** attributes: His *justice* & *knowledge*.
 - i. *Justice* God always does what is *right*! He is never *capricious* or *inconsistent* or *unjust*. He always fulfills His *promises*!
 - *ii.* And God *knows* everything about you. His understanding of you & your life is *omniscient* "*all knowing*." Of course, He knows everything about the *unbeliever*, but also everything about His *beloved*... and His *knowledge* is expressed in *love*.
- d. Which means, Christian, that God hasn't forgotten your work (fruit):
 - i. He hasn't forgotten your *horizontal fruit* (◎) your ministry to the *saints*. The "*saints*," of course, are all your fellow Christians, these **NT** "*one anothers*" that you are sharing the pews w/ this morning.
 - 1. And, beloved, read **v.10** carefully, if you are *ministering* to the saints, you are *ministering* to God!
 - a. Jesus said, "The King will answer and say to them, 'Truly I say to you, to the extent that you did it to one of these brothers of Mine, even the least of them, you did it to Me." And He won't forget....

- *ii.* But admit it even *saints* can be hard to *love*, and some days of ministry seem awful *long*, ...where do you get the *fuel* for that?
 - 1. Your *fuel* is your *love* for God (10). Your *love* for God's *name* (= *glory*, *holy reputation*). That *love* is the *vertical fruit* (10) God hasn't *forgotten*.
 - a. If you are *Christian* then you *love* God the *God of the Bible*! Everything begins with that *love*.
 - i. Including your daily, persevering ministry to the saints. 1 Jn 4:10,11 In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us, and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.
- 3.) Then as we come to **vv.11&12**, it seems Hebrews is now speaking to the entire congregation. **Not** just the *procrastinators* (1-8) and **not** just the *shaken saints* (9-10)... now it's to "each one of you."
 - a. He points *everyone* to the *same diligence* (11) & the *faith* & *perseverance* (12) of God's *beloved*. That's what he wants to see in *everyone*.
- 4.) He offers a *simple plan* to make sure you are one of God's *beloved*.
 - a. *First*, notice that his words are *urgent*. He speaks of his own *desire*...
 - i. There is the idea of "diligence," which speaks of getting w/ it!
 - ii. And warning about spiritual sluggishness.
 - 1. In **3:7** we read a similar caution: *Today* if you hear His voice do not harden your heart!
 - 2. **2 Cor 6:2** (Paul) *Now is the acceptable time, now is the day of salvation!* Paul's point was: *not tomorrow!*

- b. His *urgency* just adds weight to his *simple plan: imitation. Imitate* the lives of God's *beloved*, as seen in **vv.9&10.**
 - i. He urges them to "demonstrate the same diligence." **I.e.**, the diligence (10) in loving God & God's glory & God's people.
 - ii. **Not** *sluggish* about **your** life but instead *eagerly imitating* **their** lives. And what is *true* of the *true Christian*? Our text highlights **two** things to *imitate: faith* & *long suffering*.
 - 1. *Faith*. Not "faith in faith." Not just faith in some fuzzy idea of a god. We are talking about the *God of the Bible*…
 - a. ...and His only *condition* for your *salvation* is *faith* in Jesus Christ:
 - i. Jesus is God's only begotten Son.
 - ii. He **died** on the cross, in your place, for your sins.
 - iii. He was **raised** from the grave on the 3rd day. (As promised!)
 - iv. Jesus Christ is now the way, the truth, the life, **no one** comes to the Father except by Him.
 - v. And Jesus is *alive*, right now, *at the right* hand of the Majesty on high, and He will return to rescue, & conquer, & judge.
 - vi. *That's* the *gospel that's* the plan God demands that you put your *entire trust* in.
 - vii. Salvation means you rest your soul completely & only on Jesus' death & resurrection in your place, for your sins.

- 2. And to your *faith* add *long-suffering*. My **NASB** says *patience* (12) but better translations would be *endurance* or, even better, *long-suffering*.
 - a. Long suffering is a big deal in this letter to Hebrews Christians. Times were tough... Long-suffering is an important virtue for believers that face the threat of persecution....
 - b. Like *these* **1**st century Christians. And for many **21**st century Christians. Perhaps soon, for *us*....
- 5.) But to everyone who *believes & endures*, God offers this: *full assurance* and *inheriting the promises*.
 - a. V.11 The NT desires full assurance of hope until the end, because you believe until the end, because God sustains you & keeps you from stumbling... until the end.
 - i. This *assurance* is possible *now* because you *trust* yourself to Jesus, *now*.
 - b. And those who believe & endure *inherit* the promises (v.12b).
 - i. Who inherits a father's estate? His children! ...
 - ii. When you place your *faith* in God's Son, you are *born again* & *adopted* as God's child.
 - 1. **Eph 1:5** *In love* [God] *predestined us to adoption as sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the kind intention of His will.*
 - 2. And so we read also in Rom 8:16 & 17 The Spirit Himself testifies with our Spirit that we are children of God, and if children, heirs also, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him so that we may also be glorified with Him.

c. *Beloved*, if your *trust* is in Jesus, and your *soil* is bearing fruit, the Father's *inheritance* is yours! Because He is *just*. You can *take it to the bank*...!

The Book of Hebrews is so uniquely rich that I almost want to turn around and go through it again! But for now we'll leave it at this: Jesus is new & better.

- 1. **Jesus is better.** Jesus is the *new & better & ultimate & eternal* King & High Priest. *Exalted* and *established* at the right hand of throne of the Majesty on High! *Ruling* and *interceding*! And that keeps us *secure*.
- **2. Jesus'** *gospel* **is** *better***.** Christ made a "once for all" sacrifice in our place so that *all* of our sins are *forgiven*. By God's grace, we can now have a *new* heart and mind and spirit.
- 3. But there is a warning label attached to the Letter to the Hebrews: leave and press on. Get off the fence and run to Jesus. Or else...
- 4. Assurance is better. Better than fear...better than doubt! I speak with people who say, "I think I'm saved"; "I hope I'm going to heaven."
 - a. The Bible promises that you can be *confident* right now you are *headed heaven* when you die!
 - i. We've just read in **Heb. 6** we are **convinced** of better things & things that accompany **salvation!**
 - ii. Elsewhere, the **Apostle John** wrote these things I have written unto you that believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life!
 - iii. We also read in **Romans 10**: He who believes in Him will **not** be disappointed!
 - b. If you have *turned from* your sins & unbelief, & *trusted* in Christ's *death* & *resurrection* to pay for all you *sins*, & your life is *bearing the fruit* of the Holy Spirit's presence in you, you can be *confident* that you are *saved*.
