Almost every objection against election emerges from a lack of understanding of depravity.

- I. The Doctrine of Election Defined Steele and Thomas, 30 Boettner, 26
- II. The Major Objections
 - A. It violates my free-will
 - -misunderstanding depravity
 - -What if God did leave it up to your free will (which is bound to your sinful, fallen nature)?
 - B. It is not fair
 - -God operates in terms of justice or mercy, but never injustice.
 - -What if He were to do what was "fair"? We would all receive justice.
 - -Orphanage-Folsom Prison
 - C. It is based on foreknowledge not sovereign grace

- III. The Weight of Biblical Truth
 - A. The meaning of the word "choose," "elect"

-if God's choice was based on your choice, then the Bible should talk about us electing and choosing. When it did talk of God's choice based on your choice, it should talk of God's ratification, not election.

- -"Didn't I choose?" Yes, He just worked on your chooser first! And your chooser chose because you were chosen!

IV. The Issue at Stake

A. Is it all of grace or not? (If conditional, it destroys grace) Rom. 11:5-6 Who will get to boast? 1 Cor. 1:26-31; Eph. 2:9
