- II. **1 Corinthians 3:18-23** Let no one deceive himself by ignoring the wealth of heritage that God has given to the church.
  - A. vss. 18-20 *Let no one deceive himself* 
    - 1. Self-deception and the Christian
    - 2. The basis of self-deception thinking oneself wise
      - a. Pr 26:12, Is 5:21, Rom 12:16, Pr 3:7
      - b. True wisdom holds a high view of God and low view of self
      - c. True wisdom is foolish to the world (opposite of the world)
    - 3. God will reveal the emptiness of man's crafty wisdom, and bring all of his plotting and scheming to naught.
      - a. Job 5:12, Ps 94:11
  - B. <u>vss. 21-23</u> The particular kind of wisdom in the church at Corinth
    - 1. Do no boast in men
    - 2. Their factions caused them to miss out on God's blessing
      - a. These were men who preached the true Gospel
      - b. How boasting in or deriding the names of Gospel ministers robs the church of valuable resources
      - c. Beware of "guilt by association"
      - d. learn to be discerning (in the real sense of the word)
    - 3. Paul shuts the mouths of factionalists with great theology and doxology "You are Christ's and Christ is God's"
      - a. stop trifling over human personalities
      - b. the Trinity is the basis of unity!
- III. **1 Corinthians 4:1-5** Let us so consider God's ministers, as servants who must give account for his message, to God alone.
  - A. Pastors and church leaders are stewards of the Gospel message
  - B. The Pastor's master is not the congregation, but God
    - 1. Even one's conscience is not the final arbiter
    - 2. Ezekiel's stewardship of the Word Ez 3:17-21
    - 3. Paul's stewardship of the Word in Ephesus Acts 20:17-29
  - C. A future judgment relieves us of requiring vengeance now
  - D. A future judgment guards us against pride
