The Piercing of Christ John 19:31-37

I. Introduction

A. Review

- The earthly life & ministry of Christ in the flesh has ended—He's finished the work given Him to do, obeying His Father to the uttermost
- 2. Now, in His last act, He surrenders His spirit into His Father's Hands
- 3. His **reward**, the **payment** for His **service**, unseen **now**, **surely** follows!

B. What Day is This?

- 1. Much has been written concerning the exact day of Christ's death
- 2. Some want to **synchonize** His **death** with that of the **Passover** Lamb:
 - a. They cite Vs. 14 & claim the Passover has not yet been eaten
 - b. However, the "paraskeue" was all but synonomous with Friday,
 & "Passover" might refer to the entire week of feasting—Lk. 22:1
 - c. If **not**, it brings us into **direct** contradiction w/the **Synoptics**!
- B. Better, to see this as **Friday**, w/the **Sabbath** following a "**special**" one!

C. What They Did

- 1. This explains then the motivation of the Jews to remove the bodies:
 - a. Roman practice let them die slowly & then leave their bodies
 - b. But **Deut. 21:22-23** required bodies **not** to remain overnight
- 2. Since this was Passover, Pilate was willing to grant this concession
- 3. So, to hasten death, the soldiers broke (or smashed) the legs of the crucfied man—presumably making it more difficult to breathe
- 4. But, finding **Jesus** already **dead**, one **pierces** His **side**, from which flows **blood** & **water—THAT'S** what **happened**, **what** does it **MEAN**?

II. The Piercing of Christ

A. He's a MAN

- 1. This **might** not sound **controversial** to **us**, but **was** to **John's** readers!
- Because of Greek ideas, w/its assertion that all matter was evil, there
 was a tendency to deny Jesus' material body—"Docetism"
- But it undermined the atonement! For if He only seemed to have to have a body, He only seemed to suffer & only seemed to die!
- 4. John reasserts the info in *Jn. 1:14*—the "Word" became "flesh"!
 - a. If He's but a phantom, or "God in a man-suit", we expect a hiss!
 - b. Cp. Jewish lit. that suggests man is mainly "blood & water"
 - Point: To "monkey" with the Gospel in 1 place alters it in another!

B. He's DEAD

- These executioners were experienced, & an almost universal law required that anyone failing to execute someone took their place!
- 2. In this case, w/Jesus dying quickly the soldier makes certain He's not just in a swoon, unconcious, or in a coma—He's dead!
- 3. Cp. "Passover Plot" that claimed this—but this contradicts it!

C. He's the FULFILLER of PROPHECY

1. Re: **Vs. 28**—is His death **orchestrated**? Surely **none** would claim it **here**—for He's **dead**, yet it's **followed** by **2** unanticipated **actions**!

- 2. They **DID** break the legs of the **others**, but did **NOT** break **HIS** legs!
 - In so doing, they fulfill prophecy—maybe Ps. 34:20, but certainly Ex. 12:46 & Num. 9:12 concerning the Passover lamb!
 - b. It's even more striking as it occurs during Passover, & He's been declared the LAMB taking away SIN (*Plus*, *I Cor. 5:7*)
- 3. That they did **NOT** pierce the **OTHERS**, but they **DID** pierce **HIM**!
 - a. This fulfills **Zech. 12:10** (difficult!), where the **repentance** of **Israel** is **coupled** with their "**looking**" on the one they **pierced**!
 - b. Already **Zech. 13:7** is quoted in *Matt. 26:31* & *Mark 14:27*
- At the least, prophecy continues to be fulfilled after His death, supplying the wounds which identify Him to us—Jn. 20:20,27; Rev. 5:6

D. He's the FULFILLER of TYPES

- 1. Is there some DEEPER, SYMBOLIC meaning here? Cp. I Jn. 5:6,8
 - a. Some (Chrysostom) said it's the sacraments—hard to see!
 - b. More likely, it's what Toplady had in mind in "Rock of Ages"
 - c. Throughout the **LAW** we see constantly **BLOOD** & **WATER**

2. Consider **BLOOD**:

- "Blood" came from a "vicarious" sacrifice—to represent the appeasement of wrath upon the guilt of sin
- b. Further, not just blood in the veins but blood "poured out" on the altar—see Lev. 17:11--& HERE it's SHED in a visible way!
- Note Rev. 7:14—Washing something in blood doesn't cleanse it from defilement, but from GUILT!
- d. I'm free from guilt because washed in the blood of a substitute!
- e. Cp. **Toplady—**"Payment, God cannot **twice** demand..."

Consider WATER:

- a. Water was always employed in the removal of uncleanness
- b. Sometimes, **mixed** w/ashes (Red Heifer) or **blood** (Leper)
- c. Note *John 3:5* & its connection w/*Eze. 36:25*—There is a washing of the Spirit (*Regeneration—Tit. 3:5*) that cleanses us!
- d. Farfetched? Cp. Zech. 12:10 w/13:1-- "In that day there shall be a FOUNTAIN opened to the house of David & to the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin & for uncleanness"—blood & water!
- e. Doesn't this **permeate** our **hymnology—'Rock** of **Ages**', 'Are you **Washed**', 'There is a **Fountain**';etc.
- 4. The WATER & BLOOD, applied by the SPIRIT do TESTIFY!
 - a. Our conscience is sprinkled w/His blood & its condemning voice is silence—Cp. E.W.—It answers in 2 COURTS!
 - b. Our lives are washed w/water—we're "cleanned up", inside & out, w/no more taste for sin but a love of the law & holiness!
- 5. It's real, it's real, O I know, It's real; Praise God the doubts are settled!
