	a.	The	of Jesus: Messiah & Son of God (1:1-8:30). This section begins			
		with Mark's declaration and ends with Peter's proclamation, You are the Christ.				
		Matthew adds the rest of Peter's statement, the Son of the Living God (16:16).				
	b.	The	of Jesus: The Suffering Servant of the Lord (8:31-16:20).			

3. Jesus' miracles in Mark up to chapter 6.

Jesus' Miracles in Mark	Reference
Healed the demon-possessed.	1:21-28, 32, 39; 5:1-20
Healed physical illnesses including leprosy.	1:29-34; 40-45; 2:1-12; 3:1-6; 5:21-43
Raised the dead.	5:21-43
Calmed a storm.	4:35-41

4. These miracles are hints that Jesus was something more than a prophet. But, the OT prophets did some pretty amazing things through God's power.
