In all three situations here, he quoted from Deuteronomy 6 and 8. He knew which scriptural truths and principles to bring out to cast down Satan's attempts to lure him into sin.  (Satan quoted this text from Psalm 91to try and lure Jesus into jumping off the pinnacle of the temple.)

Jesus knew the redemptive significance of the OT incidents and experiences of God's people.

		Jesus' Understood the Heart of OT Religion
Luke 2:49 49 And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" This text shows that at age 12 Jesus not only understood that the OT reveals God as Father but that he had a personal, intimate relationship with his heavenly Father.

It was this understanding that true religion was based on, first of all, love for Yahweh. Secondly, love for one's neighbor defined the way God would have us relate to our fellow human beings. It was this understanding that enabled him to discern the hypocrisy of many of his fellow Jews, whose religion had slipped into legalism – keeping a list of rules, many created by men and not by God – giving people a false sense of their approval by God, when, in fact, their surface religion was opposed to the true religion of love and devotion to God and loving service to one's neighbors.

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		Jesus knew how to apply principles in the OT to contemporary situations.
Mark 10:6-8 6 But from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female.' 7 'Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, 8 and the two shall become one flesh.' 		Jesus declared his great redemptive acts which are found in the OT

		Jesus understood the meaning of Yahweh's words which were often missed by people.

		Jesus announced that the OT prophecies of the Messiah were fulfilled in himself.
Luke 4:16-21  16 He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, 17 and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written:  18 "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners  and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free,  19 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."  20 Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. 		Jesus Declared that He Himself Came to Fulfill the Law and the Prophets
Matt 5:17  17 "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.		
		Jesus Reveals that he is the Centerpiece of the whole OT
Luke 24:44  44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."		Jesus is referring to all the references to himself found in the 3 major parts of the OT, in other words, in the entire OT. He is making an astounding claim: he is saying that the whole OT was chiefly about him, predicting his coming and his ministry, his person and work, his death, resurrection, and ascension.
