# Peter's Summary of Old Testament Predictions of Jesus

	<b>PROPHET</b>	<b>PROPHECY</b>
Acts 3:25	<u>2000 BC</u> <b>ABRAHAM</b>	<b>GENESIS 22</b> ( PAGE 14 ) – “In your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed.”
3:22	<u>1500 BC</u> <b>MOSES</b>	<b>DEUTERONOMY 18</b> ( PAGE 139 ) – “God will raise up for you a prophet like me... it is to him you shall listen.”
3:24	<u>1000 BC</u> <b>SAMUEL</b>	<b>2 SAMUEL 7</b> ( PAGE 224 ) – “I will raise up your offspring... and I will establish...his kingdom forever.”
3:24	<b>“ALL OTHERS”</b> <i>for instance, <u>500 BC</u></i>	<b>ZECHARIAH 12</b> ( PAGE 680 ) – “Then they will look on Me whom they pierced.”
