2 Chronicles 29 — "The Importance of Biblical Worship: Hezekiah's Restoration of Biblical Worship!"

Society may seem bleak, so much lack of life, but when God's WORD is exalted, his TRUTH is upheld, his GOSPEL is proclaimed, His SPIRIT energizes, then mighty things happen!

And that's precisely what Hezekiah's kingship shows us.

King Hezekiah -- the man:

Name means: "Yahweh strengthens"

- He is extremely important (his record is recorded in great detail in 3 accounts of Scripture 2 Chron 29-32; 2 Kings 18-20; Isa 36-39 [note: Isaiah the prophet was an eyewitness of the events & a royal prophet who advised & prophesied to King Hezekiah himself!]).
- Interestingly, the account in 2 Kings focuses on his political/military affairs and only <u>one</u> verse to his religious reform, but the 2 Chronicles account focuses almost entirely on his religious reforms!

We need reformation. We desperately need a "reformation"; a revival; a restoration of God's worship — of holy worship, of a toweringly high view of God. We don't need new truth. We need a recovery of God's already revealed Truth and a fresh commitment to and a powerful proclamation of this sufficient Truth both to save and to sanctify!

WHAT DOES HEZEKIAH DO? WHAT DOES REFORMATION LOOK LIKE???

What are some elements in reformation. From this chapter, we'll see 6 elements of true reformation.

Is there hope?

by the power of God - YES! by the power of Gospel - YES! by the power of GRACE - YES!

Hezekiah is a godly leader, a portrait of people that we desperately need in our day...

And this great king (albeit imperfect) *points us* to an even greater One! King Jesus who will have a greater Kingdom (Psalm 72 & Isaiah 2).

Conclusion:

In 1555, two Church of England bishops were burnt at the stake by the hands of the Catholic Queen Mary, Nicholas Ridley and Hugh Latimer.

When they were on trial, Ridley was asked if he believed the pope was heir to the authority of Peter as the foundation of the Church, he replied that the church was not built on any man but on the truth Peter confessed -- that Jesus Christ was the Son of God. Ridley said he could not honor the pope in Rome since the papacy was seeking its own glory, not the glory of God.

Furthermore, neither Ridley nor Latimer could accept the Roman Catholic mass as a sacrifice of Christ. Latimer told the commissioners, "Christ made one oblation and sacrifice for the sins of the whole world, and that a perfect sacrifice; neither needeth there to be, nor can there be, any other propitiatory sacrifice."

These biblically true statements were deeply offensive to Roman Catholic theologians.

Latimer was burned next to Ridley. While walking together to the place of execution, Latimer said:

"Play the man, Master Ridley; we shall this day light such a candle, by God's grace, in England, as I trust shall never be put out!"

"It's time for a new Reformation in the Church--to call the Church back to the authority of the Word of God, beginning in Genesis." (Kem Ham)

"Christians in revival are accordingly found living in God's presence (Coram Deo), attending to His Word, feeling acute concern about sin and righteousness, rejoicing in the assurance of Christ's love and their own salvation, spontaneously constant in worship, and tirelessly active in witness and service, fueling these activities by praise and prayer." (JI Packer)

"Revival, above everything else, is a glorification of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is the restoration of Him to the center of the life of the Church. You find this warm devotion, personal devotion, to Him." (Martyn Lloyd Jones)
