Responding to Injustice Acts 21:27-40

Main Point:

When you are wronged by others, take comfort in God's sovereignty and keep serving Him, like Jesus your Savior.

1. Christians are not immune from injustice.

2. But injustice cannot frustrate God's plan for you.

3. You should also not let injustice keep you from serving God.

4. This is the path your Savior took, as the Suffering Servant.

Acts 21:11 ¹¹ When he had come to us, he took Paul's belt, bound his *own* hands and feet, and said, "Thus says the Holy Spirit, 'So shall the Jews at Jerusalem bind the man who owns this belt, and deliver *him* into the hands of the Gentiles.'" (NKJV)

Acts 23:11 ¹¹ But the following night the Lord stood by him and said, "Be of good cheer, Paul; for as you have testified for Me in Jerusalem, so you must also bear witness at Rome." (NKJV)
