Rash Words & Foolish Vows

Ecclesiastes 5:1-7

- I. GOING TO CHURCH (Ps 14 & 15; Heb 10:25)—Corporate worship
 - A. Guard Your Steps. (1a)—prepare; think about what you're doing
 - 1. Where you are going—the House of the LORD
 - **2.** Why you are going—to worship God; to hear God's Word; to seek His blessing
 - 3. The Manner in which you are approaching—your demeanor
 - B. <u>Draw Near to Listen</u>. (1b; Hab 2:20)—check your attitude
 - 1. Humble
 - 2. Attentive
 - C. <u>Don't Offer the Sacrifice of Fools</u>. (Isa 1:10-17)
 - 1. **Don't BE a fool.** (Ps 14:1-2; Heb 11:6) come in faith, take God seriously
 - 2. Examine your heart. (1c)
 - **a.** <u>Hypocrisy</u> (1 Sam 15:22) Your life not in keeping with your religious devotion
 - **b.** <u>Formalism</u> (Isa 1:13 & 29:13; 2 Tim 3:5; 1 Cor 13:1-3) Empty ritual, manmade traditions without actually knowing or caring to know God Himself.
 - **c.** <u>Irreverence</u> (2b) Failing to recognize and act in accordance with the awesome holiness of God
 - **3. Don't talk <u>too much</u>**. (2,3,7; Job 23:4; Mat 6:7)

- **II.** MAKING A VOW (4-6; Deut 23:21-23; Acts 5:1-11)—promise to God or to someone else in His name, making Him your witness
 - **A.** <u>Legitimate Expression of Worship</u> (Deut 6:13; 10:20) proclaims your God, the one you consider worthy of reverence and fear
 - B. Certain Qualifications for Vows
 - 1. It is voluntary. (5)—a gift or consecration that is not assumed or required
 - **2.** It is <u>considered</u>. (2, 6)—you have thought about it, mulled it over;
 - a. Don't be <u>rash</u>. (Jud 11:30)—not spontaneous or ill-advised
 - **b. Make sure you have the** <u>ability</u>. Don't overestimate your prospects or strength in the future
 - 3. You must pay it. (4; Ps 15:4)—all of it, promptly
- **III. FEARING GOD** (7)—stand in awe of God; it all comes down to this
 - A. There IS a God. He is real.
 - B. He is in Heaven. He is holy.
 - C. He is a Person. He is relational.
 - 1. He hears (2)—what you say and what you think
 - **2.** He can be <u>offended</u>. (4b,6)—presumption chooses to sin against God (rather than trouble yourself or offend someone else), assuming/demanding that He will forgive you—shows what you really think of Him
 - 3. He will hold you accountable. (6c)
 - **D.** <u>He is worthy of fear.</u> (Prov 1:7; 9:10; 14:27; 29:25; Isa 8:12-13; Ps 19:4, 9). The fear of God is what orders our lives and makes life worth living. Never invoke the name of your God lightly.
