Introduction: Review

The Apostle Paul was a man of the cross.

Christ's mission was the cross

The Gospel's foundation is the cross.

Anthropocentric and theocentric views of the cross.

Cause for the cross. The severity of God and the kindness of God

The necessity of the cross. God's plan of redemption.

The work of the cross. Deals with the judicial and relational problems of sin.

Augustus Toplady, "Let the water and the blood from the wounded side which flowed be of sin a double cure save from wrath and make me pure."

How atonement works.

1. Penal Substitution view. Christ took our place and paid our penalty.

The Passover lamb that the people of Israel sacrificed on the eve of their deliverance from bondage to Egyptian slavery was a penal substitution.
