BIBLE DISCUSSION GROUP STUDY QUESTIONS

In preparation for Sunday, November 15, 2020

Memory Passage: Hebrews 10:11-14 (continued memorizing from last week)

DAY 1 - ASK FOR INSIGHT

READ THE PASSAGE

Passage: Hebrews 10:11-18

- (a) **Read Heb. 10:1-18**. Review 10:1-10 and write a sentence summarizing the main idea of these verses.
- (b) How are verses 11ff connected to vs. 1-10 (notice v. 11 begins with "and")?
- (c) What are the 4 characteristics of the Levitical priests' work mentioned in v. 11?
- (d) How are these 4 characteristics specifically countered (notice the "but" beginning v. 12) by Christ's work (vs. 12, 14).

DAY 2 – ASK FOR INSIGHT

READ THE PASSAGE

- (a) **Read Hebrews 10:11-18.** What Psalm (chapter and verse) is alluded to in vs. 12-13?
- (b) How has our author used Psalm 110:1 in his argument so far (cf. 1:3, 13, 8:1)? What purpose does it serve here?
- (c) When will Christ's enemies "be made a footstool for his feet?"
- (d) Why the delay between the victory over sin wrought in Christ's sacrifice and the victory over His enemies?

DAY 3 - ASK FOR INSIGHT

READ THE PASSAGE

- (a) **Read Heb. 10:11-18**. How has Christ's single offering accomplished believers being "perfected for all time?"
- (b) Does "being sanctified" refer to progressive sanctification (the process by which believers are conformed to the image and likeness of Christ) or does it refer in a timeless way to the believer's once-for-all cleansing of sin? One way to help you decide is to see how the word has been and will be used in the context of the entire book: 2:11; 9:13-15; 10:10, 14, 29; 13:12.
- (c) In what ways is the new better than the old (contrasting 10:14 with 10:1).

DAY 4 - ASK FOR INSIGHT

READ THE PASSAGE

- (a) Read Heb 10:11-18. Why does our author say the Holy Spirit "also" bears witness to us? Who else has done so?
- (b) Why does our author quote again from Jeremiah 31 (cf. 8:8-12)? In other words, why do these truths need repeating, and what purpose do they serve in these verses as our author wraps up his theological argument?
- (c) How do the blessings of the New Covenant (10:15-18) overcome the weaknesses of the Old Covenant (10:1-4)?
- (d) Read (or skim) Hebrews 5:1-10:18 and summarize the main idea in one sentence.

DAY 5 - ASK FOR INSIGHT

READ THE PASSAGE

- (a) **Read Heb. 10:11-18**. How do these verses enable, empower, and fuel your worship (i.e. your drawing near to God), both individual and corporate?
- (b) How does the fact that "there is no longer any offering for sin" help you to fight your own sin?
- (c) Re-read Hebrews 10:1-18 with the purpose of answering this question: "How would I present the gospel to someone using only these verses?"
- (d) How do these verses help you, and anyone who asks you, to gain a deeper assurance of your salvation?

DATE: November 15, 2020 PASSAGE: Hebrews 10:11-18

A Single, Sufficient Sacrifice

In Hebrews 10:1-18 our author brings his exposition to a climax by emphasizing 2 sweeping contrasts between the Old and New covenants.

- I. 1st Contrast: Good things—the shadow vs. the reality.
 - A. The law has but a shadow . . . (v. 1a)
 - 1. Never perfecting the worshiper (vs. 1-2).
 - 2. Always reminding, never cleansing, of sin (vs. 3-4).
 - B. Christ is the reality.
 - 1. Coming in obedience to God's will (vs. 5-7).
 - 2. Coming to establish the new (vs. 8-9).
 - 3. Coming to perfect the worship (v. 10).
- II. 2nd Contrast: The offerings—repetition vs. finality.
 - A. The priests stand, offering repeatedly, but the worshiper is not perfected (v. 11).
 - B. Christ sits, offers Himself once for all, and the worshiper is perfected.
 - 1. Because God was pleased (vs. 12-13).
 - 2. Because perfection is eternal (v. 14).
 - 3. Because the Holy Spirit bears witness to the promise (vs. 15-18).
