We are committed to the full inspiration and authority of the Bible in all matters of faith and life. In addition to the Westminster Standards, we also maintain the Testimony of the Reformed Presbyterian Church of North America, which is our denomination's own continuing and contemporary application of the Word of God to our current culture and context.

Although we earnestly contend for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints (Jude 3), we also sincerely desire that our theology would transform our individual and family life. Thus, we strive to love and serve one another in the church and seek to be lights in a dark world. In both our doctrine and practice, our ultimate goal is to glorify God and enjoy Him in all things (1 Cor. 10:31; Ps. 16:11).
