- Following the Way of Jesus...

Acts 18:25-26

²⁵ He had been instructed in *the way* of the Lord. And being fervent in spirit, he spoke and taught accurately the things concerning Jesus, though he knew only the baptism of John. ²⁶ He began to speak boldly in the synagogue, but when Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him aside and explained to him *the way* of God more accurately.

- 2. The Way of Love (Cf. Matthew 22:37-40)

Big Picture: In Spite of Righteous Judgment... Mercy

Deuteronomy 2:2-5a, 7b-8

Then the Lord said to me, ³ 'You have been traveling around this mountain country long enough. Turn northward ⁴ and command the people, "You are about to pass through the territory of your brothers, the people of Esau (Edom), who live in Seir; and they will be afraid of you. So be very careful. ⁵ Do not contend with them, for I will not give you any of their land...

⁷...These forty years *the Lord your God has been with you*. You have lacked nothing." ' ⁸ So we went on, away from our brothers, the people of Esau, who live in Seir... "And we turned and went in the direction of the wilderness of Moab.

Why is this story included here?

1. <u>A foil</u> to better understand the conquest of Canaan.

2. Signs of Life... (Cf. Num. 21:4)

Foil: *n.* a person or thing that contrasts with and so emphasizes and enhances the qualities of another.

Respecting Authority in a Fallen World

Key Idea

It is often difficult to obey God in a world that doesn't.

Messengers Sent to the King of Edom (14-21)

- Brothers... (Esau is _____'s brother)
- Hardships...Egypt...
- ¹⁶ And when we cried to the Lord, he heard our voice and *sent an angel* (Cf. Ex. 14:19-20; ls. 63:11-12) and brought us out of Egypt. ...
- ... "Please let us pass through your land"
- *Edom:* 'No way', "lest we come out with the sword against you."
- *Israel:* 'We will pay a toll...'
- **Edom:** Assembled a strong show of force...

Bottom Line

Edom exercised its authority in an unloving manner. **Israel,** in submission to God respected Edom's harsh decision.

Respect for God-Given, Ungodly Authority

Key Idea

Respect for neighboring nations...
Respect for God's authority points at the righteousness of Jesus. (Cf. John 19:10–11 – Pilate)

Titus 2:9–10 (HCSB)

⁹ Slaves are to be submissive to their masters in everything, and to be well-pleasing, not talking back ¹⁰ or stealing, but demonstrating utter faithfulness, so *that they may adorn the teaching of God our Savior* in everything.

Matt. 27:43 (HCSB)

1 Peter 2:13–16, 18–19, 21–24

or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good. ¹⁵ For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people. 16 Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but *living as servants of God*. ... Servants, be subject to your masters with all respect, not only to the good and gentle but also to the unjust. ¹⁹ For this is a gracious thing, when, mindful of God, one endures sorrows while suffering unjustly. ... 21 For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an **example**, so that you might follow in his steps. ²² He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. 23 When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly. ²⁴ He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed.

¹³ Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human

institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, ¹⁴

1 Peter 3:12–15 (Wives – 3:1–6)

¹² For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil."

13 Now who is there to harm you if you are zealous for what is good? 14 But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, 15 but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect...

Key Idea

Our submission to Jesus means we make it our business to serve everyone, including every human authority.

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
