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Intro:

Preface to 10 Commandments: Exodus 20:2. READ WLC Q&A 101.

<u>Main Point of Text:</u> Because God is their covenant God, His people are to keep and do all that He commands.

Sermon Point: Rightly respond to your Redeemer.

Move 1: There is only the LORD.

LC: "Wherein God manifesteth his sovereignty, as being JEHOVAH:" Yahweh reveals total authority:

1. LC: "the eternal [no beginning/end], immutable [cannot change], and almighty [complete power] God": *Thus saith the LORD the <u>King of Israel</u>, and his <u>redeement</u> he <u>LORD of hosts</u>; I am <u>the first</u>, and I am <u>the last</u>; and <u>beside me there is no God</u>. (Isaiah 44:6)*

2. LC: "having his being in and of himself" Self existent. Does not rely on anyone or anything else: And God said unto Moses, <u>IAM THAT I AM</u>: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, <u>I AM hath sent</u> me unto you. (Exodus 3:14) (speaking within a burning bush)

Move 2: You only exist and live because of the LORD.

LC: "and giving being to all his words and works": mankind has no being w/o God. And <u>I appeared unto Abraham</u>, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by the name of God Almighty, but by my name JEHOVAH was I not known to them. (Exodus 6:3). Reminds you of your relationship. READ Acts 17:24-28

Move 3: The LORD keeps His gracious promises to you.

LC: "and that he is a God in <u>covenant</u>": agreement that establishes a solemn relationship. Isaiah 28:15, 18: "covenant" and "agreement" synonyms. God obliges Himself to His people (Gen. 15:17) LC: "with Israel of old ... who, as <u>he brought them out of their bondage in Egypt</u>": *And I will establish my* <u>covenant between me and thee and thy seed after thee in their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be a</u> <u>God unto thee, and to thy seed after thee</u>. (Genesis 17:7) Prophesy of Gen. 15:13-16 includes promise. LC: "as ... so with all his people ... he delivereth us from our spiritual thraldom". Jesus.

Is he the God of the Jews only? *is he* not also of the Gentiles? Yes, <u>of the Gentiles also</u>: (Rom. 3:29) ... *being delivered out of the hand of our enemies* [we] might *serve him without fear, In holiness and*

righteousness before him, all the days of our life. (Luke 1:74-75)

Move 4: You are bound to live your life in honor of your loving LORD.

LC: "therefore we are bound to take him for our God alone, and to keep all his commandments": Saved not by obedience, but saved to obedience.

- <u>READ 1 Peter 1:15-19.</u> Vs. 16 Lev. 19:2. Ceremonial/judicial laws fulfilled; Moral Law furthered.
- Therefore shall ye keep <u>mine ordinance</u>, that ye commit not any one of these abominable customs, which were committed before you, and that ye defile not yourselves therein: I am the LORD <u>your God</u>. (Leviticus 18:30).
- Ex. 20:2: "Lord your God"; "brought you out"

Leviticus 19:37. LORD (Yahweh, also covenant name):

- "Ye": personal. God's people. Not focused on others. YOU.
- "observe [keep]/do": You are responsible to active participation in the covenant.
- "statutes/judgements": prescribed ways of life in the covenant relationship.
- "my/my": not generic, personal: "I am the LORD". Reason given 15 times in chapter. Given in 11:44-45 for why to be holy. How he begins preface.

Conclusion:

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Act like saved people living for Jesus Christ. John 14:15.

Rightly respond to your Redeemer.
