## Introduction

  All of these elements will answer the question Why was the gospel preached and how is it
  to be used?
- I. The Gospel is to be used on the day of judgment to give an account to the one who stands ready to Judge
- II. The Gospel is to be used as a comfort in death
  - A. Who are the "dead" to whom the gospel was preached?
    - 1. By "dead," he does not mean Spiritually dead
    - 2. By "dead," he does not mean those who died without believing in Christ and are therefore given a second chance after death (Heb 9:27)
    - 3. By "dead," he does not mean those who died before Christ's coming
    - 4. By "dead," he means those who had heard the gospel, believed, and then died. The NIV translates it this way, "to those who are *now* dead."
  - B. The Purpose of the Gospel
    - 1. The preaching of the gospel was never meant to save us from physical death but from eternal death (cf 1 Thess 4:13–18)
- III. The Gospel is to be used daily in life as a recalibration to true North
  - A. What is foremost in your mind as you think about the promise of the gospel in your life now? Comfort or a Cross?
  - B. Do you judge the efficacy and beauty of the gospel by the success, comfort, and well-being of your life now? (cf. 1 Peter 4:12–13)
  - C. Judging the efficacy of the gospel by what happens to you in this life is like taking a brand-new car back to the dealership because it sunk when you tried to drive it through a lake.
  - D. Baptism is a crucifixion to the world
