Call to Worship

This exchange, from the scene in Revelation 5, begins when the angel speaks to John, who has been weeping because no one in heaven or on earth could be found to open the scroll (representing the New Covenant) and its seals, thus ratifying and securing its blessings for God's people. But Christ, who is both the Lion and the Lamb, has accomplished this victory, which is why we praise God today!

Revelation 5 ESV

Leader: Weep no more; behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that He can open the scroll and its seven seals.

Congregation: Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation, and you have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they shall reign on the earth. Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power, and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!

All:To Him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!

The Apostles' Creed

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
