### **Grant Van Leuven**

#### Intro:

<u>Main Point of Text:</u> God sees the wickedness of Judah and his family and gets involved in their short- and long-term needs.

Sermon Point: We all need the Savior.

# Move 1: God has put the hope of future life in our hearts.

Vs. 8, 11. Leviterate marriage an ancient custom. Later commanded in Deuteronomy 25:5.

# Move 2: But man is totally depraved and won't get far in life.

This patriarch and the covenant family again give the Jews nothing to brag about:

- Judah's wickedness: <u>vss. 1, 11, 15-17, 23-24, 26</u>.
- Son's wickedness: <u>vss. 7, 9-10</u>.
- Tamar's wickedness: vss. 14, 16-18.

# *Move 3: And God Who sees everything will judge your life and take it.* Vs. 7, 10; Vs. 15 with 25-26.

## Move 4: But God also is merciful.

Who wants this family heritage? Yet, it is the line of the Messiah!: <u>Matthew 1:1-3</u>. Notice *sovereign* grace of election again: <u>Vs. 3</u>; Pharez – not firstborn (Gen. 38:28-29). See also <u>vss. 5, 6</u>. Four women highlighted in Christ's genealogy (three fornicators, two not Israelites). Why? Same as today's text: <u>vs. 21</u>.

How is 38 related to Joseph? He will get His people out of Canaan before totally corrupted. Will come back as a nation to wipe the land clean. Just as Jesus will make us an eternal nation to inherit a cleansed earth.
