

FOR DECEMBER:

Bangladesh

• A brother in Christ was attacked by his own family when he was found out to have converted to Christianity. In spite of the physical violence against him, he still lives with his family as he has nowhere else to go. Please pray for his protection, that the Lord would give him grace to continue following Jesus and to be a witness to all.

Indonesia

• A woman, after having dreams about the Lord, became a believer. When her family found out they cut her off from all association and support. Pray that that the Lord would strengthen her and that other Christians would rally around her to support her holistically.

Philippines

• A sister was called a traitor by neighbors for following Jesus. The emotional pain of many who face regular ostracization and social pressure is so often very deep. Pray for the presence and consolation of God's Spirit among those who suffer for their faith like this.

Egypt

- A Christian brother was killed outside his workshop. His attackers claimed they killed him because of their loyalty to Allah demanded this response. Please pray for all Christians who face threats of violence, along with restrictions of their human rights simply because they claim the name of Christ.
- Sudan
 - Four young men were arrested in a church raid in Sudan, where they were worshiping together. They were beaten and then legally charged under an apostasy code that was supposed to have been abolished in 2019. Pray that these believers will be released and will receive impartial justice.

Myanmar

• Believers in Myanmar often have to live like unwanted outsiders in their own country. Ongoing civil war has been used as an excuse for raids on churches, including some bombings. Christians have been displaced from their homes. Pray that God will give them relief from this violence and will keep them safe as they seek to be faithful followers of Jesus.
