Main Point:

**John Currid** “The act of placing a child on someone’s knees was a well-known practice in the culture of the ancient Near East. To perform it was ‘to acknowledge [the child] as one’s own’. It signified legitimization, and possibly even some form of adoption.”

**Romans 13:13-14** <sup>13</sup> Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy. <sup>14</sup> But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to *fulfill its* lusts. (NKJV)

**James 1:17** <sup>17</sup> Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning. (NKJV)
