II Corinthians 12:13 For what is it wherein ye were inferior to other churches, except it be that I myself was not burdensome to you? forgive me this wrong. 14 Behold, the third time I am ready to come to you; and I will not be burdensome to you: for I seek not **YOURS,** but you: for the children ought not to lay up for the parents, but the parents for the children. 15 And I will very gladly spend and be spent for you; though the more abundantly I love you, the less I be loved. 16 But be it so, I did not **burden** you: nevertheless, being crafty, I caught you with guile. 17 Did I make a gain of you by any of them whom I sent unto you? 18 I desired Titus, and with him I sent a brother. Did Titus make a gain of you? walked

Characteristics of false teachers to help you recognize them!

we not in the same spirit? walked we not in the same steps?

 False teachers are proud. They seek fame, popularity, and prestige. They play to the crowd and seek the limelight

- False teachers are selfish. They seek their own comfort and prosperity
- False teachers are deceptive
- False teachers have no regard for the person of Christ, His truth, His Word, etc
- False teachers are abusive. They hurt people, lead them into sin and error
- The false teachers accuse Paul of preaching a message that wasn't worth any on the one hand while saying he didn't handle the offering right at the same time
- Paul had never wanted to be a burden to them. He did not go into the ministry to get but to give
- He had not taken from them but given to them
- 1. The Corinthians had an inferior church
 - a. Maybe he uses this term because of the way they felt about themselves
 - The idea of inferior would have been that God had not apparently blessed the church like He had others
 - c. This is the post problem ridden church that Paul writes to
 - d. This church has great sin problems

- 2. Paul had led this people to Christ 11:1 Would to God ye could bear with me a little in my folly: and indeed bear with me. 2 For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ. 3 But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ. 4 For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with him.
 - a. Paul loved God and what Jesus did on the cross so he shared the truth with them 2 For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused you to one husband, that I may present *you as* a chaste virgin to Christ.
 - b. Paul loved the Corinthians and so he shared the truth with them
 - c. Paul was afraid that he had worked with them in vain or it had been wasted effort 3 But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in

- Christ. Galatians 4:11 I am afraid of you, lest I have bestowed upon you labour in vain.
- d. Paul feared that they were accepting and believing another gospel 4 For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with him. Galatians 1:6-9 I marvel that ye are so soon removed from him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another gospel: 7 Which is not another; but there be some that trouble you, and would pervert the gospel of Christ. 8 But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed. 9 As we said before, so say I now again, If any man preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed. Galatians 3:1 O foolish Galatians, who hath bewitched you, that ye should **not obey the truth**, before whose eyes Jesus Christ hath been evidently

set forth, crucified among you? 2 This only would I learn of you, Received ye the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith? 3 Are ye so foolish? having begun in the Spirit, are ye now made perfect by the flesh?

- e. It takes a lot of work to form Christ in someone

 Galatians 4:19 My little children, of whom I travail in birth
 again until Christ be formed in you,
- f. Paul desired to see them grow to maturity in Christ Colossians 1:28 Whom we preach, warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom; that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus: Ephesians 5:27 That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish.
- g. Paul did a great work among them.
- 3. The Corinthians didn't respect Paul like they should have 11:5-6 For I suppose I was not a whit behind the very

- **chiefest apostles**. 6 But though *I be* rude in speech, yet not in knowledge; but we have been throughly made manifest among you in all things.
- a. Paul was always defending his ministry, reminding them that God made him an apostle
- b. Paul had shown the signs of an apostle 12:12 Truly the signs of an apostle were wrought among you in all patience, in signs, and wonders, and mighty deeds.
- c. They mocked Paul 10:10 For his letters, say they, are weighty and powerful; but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech contemptible.
- d. They said Paul couldn't speak well
- e. They were able to love those that preached error 11:4 For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or *if* ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, **ye might well bear with** *him*.
- 4. Paul's mistake was not being burdensome
 - a. He preached the gospel at no charge to them 11:7 Have I committed an offence in abasing myself that ye might be

- exalted, because I have preached to you the gospel of God freely?
- b. He took his salary from other churches instead of causing the Corinthians to take their own responsibility 11:8 I robbed other churches, taking wages of them, to do you service.
- c. Paul wasn't a burden to them 11:9 And when I was present with you, and wanted, I was chargeable to no man: for that which was lacking to me the brethren which came from Macedonia supplied: and in all things I have kept myself from being burdensome unto you, and so will I keep myself.
- d. This caused them to be an inferior church 12:13 For what is it wherein ye were inferior to other churches, except it be that I myself was not burdensome to you? forgive me this wrong.
- 5. Paul loved them very much. He didn't want them making money an excuse not to love Jesus 12:13 For what is it wherein ye were **inferior to other churches**, except *it be*

that I myself was not **burdensome** to you? **forgive** me this wrong.

a. He had good intentions 14 Behold, the third time I am ready to come to you; and I will not be

burdensome to you: for I seek not yours,

but you: for the children ought not to lay up for the parents, but the parents for the children.

- I am not coming to seek your stuff but to give to you
- ii. The parents ought to do for the children
- b. His mistake is the same one that parents make of being to good to their children
- c. Paul didn't want them to accuse him of taking advantage of them 15 And I will very gladly spend and be spent for you; though the more abundantly I love you, the less I be loved.
 - He loved them and was doing all he could for them
 - ii. The more he did for them the more they just took it
 - iii. The more he loved them the less they loved him
- d. It is now time for them to step up and take responsibility for their church

- e. Paul never wanted them to think that the gospel was a means of his making money 17 Did I **make a gain**of you by any of them whom I sent unto you? 18 I desired Titus, and with him I sent a brother. Did Titus

 make a gain of you? walked we not in the same spirit? walked we not in the same steps?
- 6. It is good to have a burden to carry Lamentations 3:27 *It is* good for a man that he bear the yoke in his youth.
 - a. It is good for someone to help you Galatians 6:2 Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ.
 - b. Maturity calls on you to carry your own burden Galatians 6:4 But let every man prove his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another. 5 For every man shall bear his own burden.
 - c. You are responsible to become a self feeder
 - d. You are responsible to personally repent, believe
 - e. It is not a matter of others
 - f. This is your church. You must take responsibility
 - g. It is a burden but it should be

- h. You should have a burden to take care of this church, its leadership, its ministries
- You should have a burden to get the gospel to the world
- j. You are responsible and need to live and act like it really depends on you
- k. Depending on others will only make you weaker and inferior.
- Pay your way, carry your burden, do your share, get involved
