## The Incarnation Is Proclaimed In The Supper!

Luke 2:1-14; James 1:15; Rev. 12:1-6

The joy and impact of a birth comes only through the anguish of labor. Our final word study in this series comes on the day we celebrate the sacrament of the Lord’s Supper. This word “tikto” means “to give birth to, bear, produce, or yield,” most often of physical children. It is used a whopping 263 times in Scripture (74 in Genesis alone!).
