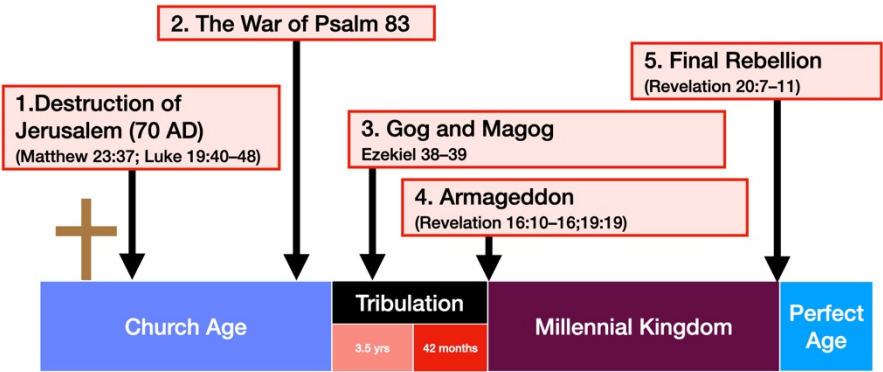

desolate — solitary, lonely, desolate, uninhabited

 - *desolations— to stun, be destitute, destroy (self), (lay, lie, make) waste, wonder*
 - *determined— to point sharply, i.e. (literally) to wound; figuratively, to be alert, to decide: — bestir self, decide, decree, determine, maim, move.*
 3. Jesus Christ’s return became _____ since AD 70 (Lu. 21:20–28).
 - *Imminent — shooting over; hence, hanging*

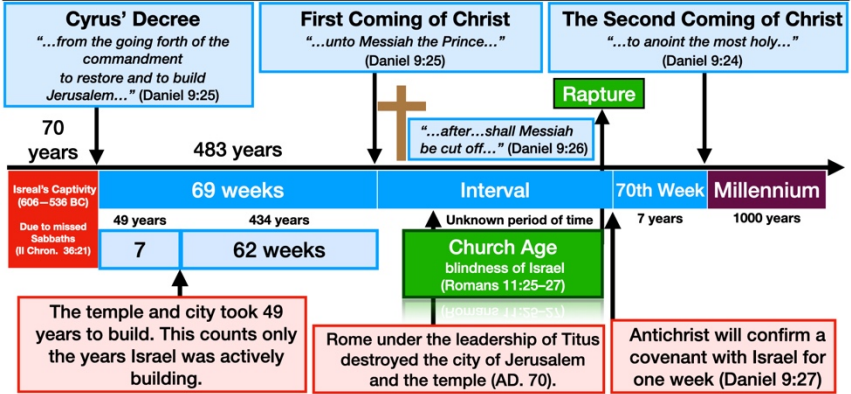
