

## ABOUT THE SERVICE

The Service of Lessons and Carols was first drawn up by Archbishop Benson, when Bishop of Truro, for use in the Truro Cathedral. It was later simplified and modified in 1918 for use in King's College Chapel, Cambridge, by its then Dean, the Very Reverend Eric Milner-White.

The service joins Scripture texts that speak of the birth of Christ with anthems and carols which highlight the themes found in those texts.

Universally beloved, this service is used with some variation all over the world.

### THE CAROLS

The carols in this morning's service come from German, French, and English sources from the fourteenth century through the nineteenth. Some of them (especially In Dulci Jubilo and Puer Nobis Nascitur) have been well-beloved in many countries and many languages for hundreds of years.
