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Intro:

<u>Main Point of Text:</u> The second trip to Egypt *shows* that Jacob and his sons are really repenting.

Sermon Point: Bear fruit.

Move 1: Don't let doubts and fears keep you from returning to God.

Vss. 3-7: Jacob continued to fear and fight the inevitable (vs. 1): <u>vs. 10</u>. <u>Vs. 14</u>: he bows to providence, like Esther (Esther. 4:16). <u>Vs. 18</u>: brothers afraid, thus move quickly with Vss. 19-22. Fears didn't happen.

Move 2: Jesus is ready to forgive you.

Joseph's merciful response. Through servant: <u>vs. 23</u>. Concerned for father: <u>Vs. 27</u>. Answers <u>Vs. 14</u> with <u>Vs. 29</u>. "El Shaddai" has family history: Gen. 17:1; 28:3-4; 35:11. God's gracious faithfulness.

Vss. 26, 28: 2nd dream fulfilled. Joseph not bitter: Vs. 30 Heb: "warmed tender mercies".

Move 3: The produce of true repentance taste great.

True repentance is <u>42:21</u>. It bears fruit: Jacob/brothers now honest (were liars). Jacob changes from <u>42:38</u> to <u>43:2, 11a, 14</u> (notice "Israel", vss. 6, 8, 11). Judah led sale of Joseph (37:26-17); now vows to keep Benjamin safe: <u>Vss. 8-9</u>. <u>Vs. 34</u>: pass test of not envying Benjamin (versus Chapter 37).

Jesus: know tree by fruits (Mt. 7:16-20). J. Baptist/Paul: *Bring forth/do ... fruits/works meet for repentance:* (Mt. 3:8/Acts 26:20). Also, YOU enjoy the fruits of repentance: <u>Vss. 33, 34c.</u>

Conclusion:

<u>Bear fruit.</u>
