## Nehemiah, part 10: "Rejoicing in Deliverance from Bondage" Nehemiah 8:13-18

God's work of revival continues.

1.	<b>God Calls His P</b>	eople to Rejoice	A discovery at Ezra's Bible Study!	vv. 13-15
----	------------------------	------------------	------------------------------------	-----------

- (1) The Gathering "Now on the second day the heads of the fathers' houses of all the people with the priests and Levites, were gathered to Ezra the scribe,
  - The heads of houses in order to understand the words of the Law." with the priests and Levites
  - To hear Ezra read and expound the Word
    - Their attentiveness to the Word, an ongoing evidence of revival!
- (2) The Discovery
- -1- The Call to Celebrate the Feast of Booths "And they found written in the Law...
  that the children of Israel should dwell in booths
  during the feast of the seventh month."
  - The Feast to be held the  $15^{th} 22^{nd}$  day of Tishri (Sept/Oct) 8 days
  - Celebrating the harvest of the summer fruit and the beginning of the olive harvest
  - All who were native Israelites were directed to gather boughs and branches and to make booths or arbors to dwell in during the days of the feast.
  - -"You shall dwell in booths for seven days. All who are native Israelites shall dwell in booths." (v. 42)
  - -"And you shall rejoice before the LORD your God for seven days." (v. 40)
  - They were to commemorate their deliverance from the bondage of Egypt
  - -"that your generations may know that I made the children of Israel dwell in booths when I brought them out of the land of Egypt. I am the LORD your God." (v. 43)
- -2- How had this been missed or neglected previously?
  - During the Babylonian captivity no real possibility; Israel under God's chastening
  - Previous to captivity Spiritual dullness
  - No zeal for such? Loss of gospel zeal
  - Inconvenient? Too much trouble? Too many other things to attend to?

2. God Moves among His People – and	They Rejoice!
(1) A Ready and Widespread Obedience!	"Then the people went out and brought them and made themselves booths So the whole assembly of those who returned from the captivity made booths and sat under the booths
- Such widespread participation unprecedented!	"since the days of Joshua the son of Nun until that day the children of Israel had not done so."
(2) Great Rejoicing!	"And there was very great gladness."
(3) Continued great attentiveness to the W	ord! "Also day by day, from the first day until the last day, he read from the Book of the Law of God.
