GIVING A BOLD WITNESS TO A BAD AUDIENCE Acts 22:1-29

So, how can we give a bold witness to a bad audience?

- Be <u>honest</u> about your personal past (v.1-5). Everyone has a <u>past</u>.
 - a. Be **<u>respectful</u>** of all people (v.1).
 - b. **Identify** with your listeners (v.2-3).
 - c. Own up to your own **<u>past deeds</u>** (v.4-5).
- 2. Be <u>clear</u> about your divine encounter (v.6-11).
 - a. God **<u>stopped</u>** me (v.6).
 - b. God pointed out my sin (v.7-9).
 - c. God told me what to do (V.10-11).
- 3. Be bold about your <u>call</u> and <u>conversion</u> (v.12-16).
 - a. Being a devout Jew and a Christian are not mutually **exclusive** (v.12-13).
 - b. God had **plans** for Paul (v.14-15).
 - c. God required bold **<u>confession</u>** of his faith (v.16).
- 4. Be **<u>obedient</u>** to the Savior's command (v.17-21).

- Be ready to receive racial and religious <u>hatred</u> (v.22-29).
 - a. He allowed the commander to **indicate his plans** (v.24).
 - b. He picked his moment to **speak up** (v.25b).
 - c. He used his **citizenship** to his advantage.

But what is this passage about?

Our circumstances **reveal** us; they don't make us.

Our circumstances grant us open doors; they don't **prevent** our witness.

God's grace is greater than all of our sin.
