Preparing to Receive the Lord's Supper

WLC Question 171: How are they that receive the sacrament of the Lord's Supper to prepare themselves before they come unto it?

Answer: They that receive the sacrament of the Lord's Supper are, before they come, to prepare themselves thereunto, by examining themselves of their being in Christ, of their sins and wants; of the truth and measure of their knowledge, faith, repentance; love to God and the brethren, charity to all men, forgiving those that have done them wrong; of their desires after Christ, and of their new obedience; and by renewing the exercise of these graces, by serious meditation, and fervent prayer.

WLC Question 172: May one who doubts of his being in Christ, or of his due preparation, come to the Lord's Supper?

Answer: One who doubts of his being in Christ, or of his due preparation to the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, may have true interest in Christ, though he be not yet assured thereof; and in God's account has it, if he be duly affected with the apprehension of the want of it, and unfeignedly desires to be found in Christ, and to depart from iniquity: in which case (because promises are made, and this sacrament is appointed, for the relief even of weak and doubting Christians) he is to bewail his unbelief, and labor to have his doubts resolved; and, so doing, he may and ought to come to the Lord's Supper, that he may be further strengthened.

Preparation for Worship

Devotional Prayer

BLESSED LORD JESUS,

I kneel before your cross and see the heinousness of my sin, my iniquity that caused you to be made a curse, the evil that excites the severity of divine wrath.

Show me the enormity of my guilt by showing me the crown of thorns, the pierced hands and feet, the bruised body, the dying cries.

Your blood is the blood of incarnate God—its worth is infinite, and its value is beyond all thought. Infinite must be the evil and guilt that demand such a price.

Sin is my disease, my monster, my enemy: born in my birth, alive in my life, strong in my character, dominating all my faculties, following me like a shadow, mingling with my every thought. Sin is the chain that holds me captive in the empire of my soul.

Sinner that I am, why should the sun give me light, the air give me breath, the earth endure my footsteps, its fruits nourish me, its creatures serve my ends?

Yet you have compassion on me, your heart hastens to my rescue, your love endured my curse, your mercy bore the stripes I deserved.

Lord Jesus, enable me to walk with you humbly and with a tender conscience, bathed in your blood and triumphing gloriously as an heir of your salvation.

Notes on Worship

BLESSING: As God gathers His people before Him in worship, He places His blessing upon them through the minister. We use the introductory blessing from Revelation 1:4-5. Notice that this blessing not only contains the usual blessing elements of 'grace and peace' found elsewhere in the New Testament, but that it is also trinitarian in its form--the blessing is from God the Father--Him who is, and who was and is to come--God the Holy Spirit-The seven spirits who are before the throne--and God the Son--Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth.


