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Sermon Notes

A Word to a Lukewarm Church (Pt. II)

Rev. 3:14-22

- I. **Intro:** Review of lessons from the letters
- II. **Exposition:** A loving, stern correction to a neutral church
 - A. From Jesus to His church in Laodicea (v.14)
 - B. Your spiritual condition is repulsive to Me (vv.15-18)
 - C. I lovingly exhort and appeal to you (vv.19-20)
 - Be zealous and repent, for I desire to have fellowship with you
 - D. To the one who receives my counsel and correction... (vv.21-22)
 - "I will grant him to sit on the throne with me" (v.21)
 - This is the Spirit's word to all the churches (v.22)
- III. **Application**: How do we avoid becoming lukewarm in our devotion to Christ?
 - 1. Guard against the spirit of our age
 - 2. Guard against influences in your life that would dampen your love for Christ
 - 3. Receive loving correction from the brethren (Prov 27:5-6)
 - 4. Don't confuse zeal for the Lord with fanaticism
 - 5. Know that love for Christ means obeying him in every area of life
 - 6. Make every effort to meet with Jesus, both privately and in the assembly
