Luke 7:1-10

OT: 2 Kings 5:8-14

Theme: The world may see our good works and praise us. But if we are to have life – and know eternal life – we must see ourselves as God sees us and humbly bow before the authority of Christ and His Word.

Background and Introduction: We move from teaching to narrative in which Jesus illustrates the very principles he has taught. The passage revolves around life and death, true worth and true authority.

I. An Unusual Request

- A. A dying servant (Nothing unusual there.)
 - 1. Death comes to us all.
 - Consequence of sin. All fell in Adam. (Romans 5:12ff)
 - We cannot escape its reach.
 - 2. More than just a "useful servant"
 - "Highly valued" or "precious"
 - Genuine concern for his welfare, restoration
- B. A Roman centurion
 - 1. A powerful man.
 - Wealthy and respected
 - Loved his enemy!
 - Loved by his enemy
 - 2. Needs Jesus' help
 - Desperate to help his servant
- C. A Jewish Delegation –

NOTE: Jesus teaching on "love your enemies" is demonstrated by a Roman "loving" his Jewish "enemies" such that, they come to defend him.

- 1. Sends Jewish elders
 - Not under duress they go willingly
- 2. Pleading his Merit His "Worth"
 - Loves our nation; Built our synagogue!
 - He is worthy of your help

NOTE: They believe he is "good" or "good enough" *merit* Jesus' blessing – as many continue to about themselves today. (Rom.3:10-12)

II. An Unworthy Servant

- A. Giving honor to Jesus
 - "I couldn't approach you"
 - "Not worthy to receive you in my home"
- B. In the world's eyes? He is **Worthy**.
 - Good name, good reputation, wealth and power

- C. In his own eyes?
 - 1. Judges self and is found "wanting"
 - What true righteousness did he possess? None.
 - Not proud with the "blessings" of this life.
 - 2. Compared to Jesus' Worth?? Not worthy!
 - Christ's worth authority righteousness??? Unsurpassed!!
 - In His own eyes? Not worthy!

NOTE/QUESTIONS:

- 1. How do you view yourself? Through the eyes of others or through Christ's eyes?
- 2. How do you view Jesus? As a good example to follow or as the holy, sinless, righteous, eternal judge and King?

III. An Unwavering Faith

- A. Trusting in Jesus' power
 - Just say the word
 - A man under authority
 - Accepts the authority of Jesus (1 Corinthians 15:54,55)
- B. Trusts in Jesus mercy
 - In true humility
 - Not in his goodness but in Christ's

IV. Christ's Unmerited Favor

- A. Amazing faith
 - -Marveled at the faith of this Gentile
 - Faith not seen in Israel
- B. Loving an enemy
 - Jesus doesn't see a sinner as his enemy if he admits he is a sinner!
 - Responds with unmerited favor and grace and blessing
- C. The gift of life!
 - 1. A dying servant is healed!
 - Jesus "says the word" and his authority rules
 - 2. A condemned Centurion finds life!
 - A foreigner finds life (Ephesians 2:8,9)

Conclusion: What will it take to bring you to the same place of humility and faith?

<u>In the eyes of the world</u> – seek to live graciously and honorably for the honor of Christ.

<u>In your own eyes</u> – see your true nature and self. Humble yourself in the sight of the Lord so that...

<u>In Christ's Eyes</u> – He looks upon the object of His mercy and grace. Humble yourselves before the Lord, **and he will exalt you.** (James 4:10)
