Ephesians: Commendation & Benediction Ephesians 6:21-24

Reading: Isaiah 12:1-6

#### ...pray...

Plan for finishing Ephesians: *this morning* I'll finish my exposition of the letter. *Next week* we'll pause for the special ministry meeting (re *remodel*), then on the **21**<sup>st</sup> & **28**<sup>th</sup> I'll review Ephesians, the *doctrinal* first half on the 21<sup>st</sup> & the *application* second half on the 28<sup>th</sup>. *All*, of course, *Deo volente* – God willing! ©

### Now, let's read the closing words of Paul's letter to the Ephesians. Vv.18-24.

Paul has just shared a *prayer request* with his friends in Ephesus: he is *in chains* (*arrest*) in Rome and awaiting his opportunity to *make his case* before *Nero*...

His request is *unselfish* & *missions-minded*: when his *day-in-court* comes, he wants to be *clear*, he wants to be *bold*, & he wants to be *faithful* to Christ.

...

There is *more* to say, of course! The months of *house arrest* had **not** been wasted...

He has deepened his fellowship w/ Christians in Rome.

He has witnessed to *every guard* that the *Emperor* has *chained* to him (*night & day*)!

He has written other important letters to the churches.

And Paul has been *supported*, as always, by his team of *missionary coworkers*.

But those details don't really all *fit well* in this letter that is **so** focused, like a *red-dot rifle sight*, on the needs of the Ephesian church.

In fact, "church" is what this Ephesian letter is largely all about.

So it's time for Paul to *finish* another prison letter and *send* it on its way.

But *last of all*, the apostle wants to let his friends know *who* is the man who is *delivering* their letter & Paul want to make his *last* words *encouraging* words!

### So the Apostle Paul wraps up his letter as he...

- 1. *Introduces* his beloved courier (vv.21-22).
- 2. Summarizes his powerful message (vv.23-24).

## Paul *entrusted* this important letter to one of his most *faithful* friends, *Tychicus*.

- 1. Perhaps as we *read* this morning's text, that *name* sounded a *little* familiar, but **not** as familiar as *Paul* or *Timothy* or *Luke* or even *Titus*...
  - a. But *Tychicus* served with Paul for about **10** years & his *name* appears **four** *other* times in your **NT**:
    - i. Acts 20:4 (57 AD) *Tychicus* is listed, along with six other men, as a group that will accompany *Paul* from Corinth to Jerusalem. *Timothy* is also in the group. *Tychicus* is identified as being from *Asia* (Turkey). *Luke* isn't listed but he's w/them.
    - ii. Colossians 4:7f (penned at the same time as Ephesians, in 60-62 AD, during Paul's 1<sup>st</sup> Roman imprisonment). Tychicus also hand-delivered their letter to them & also gave the Colossians a personal update on Paul's imprisonment. Colossians & Philemon & Ephesians were likely delivered by Tychicus in the same trip. And a runaway Colossians slave Onesemus was probably w/ him.
    - iii. **Titus 3:12** (**62-64 AD**, i.e. not long *after* Paul's **1**<sup>st</sup> Roman imprisonment) *Paul* wrote that he was considering sending *Tychicus* to relieve *Titus* on the island of Crete, where Titus had been dispatched as Paul's *emissary* to the Cretan *churches*. This would free *Titus* to report back to *Paul* (in Nicopolis).
    - iv. **2 Timothy 4:12** (late **66** or early **67** AD *winter*) *Paul* (2<sup>nd</sup> imprisonment) is *months*, perhaps only *weeks*, away from *execution*. He has sent *Tychicus* to *Timothy* in Ephesus, perhaps (again) carrying *Paul's* last known letter & to (again) relieve *Timothy* as pastor so *Timothy* could rush to Rome before *Nero* beheaded *Paul* .....
    - v. So *Tychicus* served with *Paul* throughout the amazing last *decade* of the apostle's ministry! During that period he served Paul as *courier* (*Ephesians*, *Colossians*, *Philemon*, *Titus*?, 2 *Tim*?), "reporter," & relief *emissary* (Tim & Titus?).

- b. *All* of which help us understand the *foundation* from which *Paul* wrote in **v.21** that *Tychicus* was the apostle's *beloved* brother (in Christ) & *faithful* minister in the Lord.
  - i. Faithful minister in the Lord probably means that Tychicus has served Paul long & faithfully because of his service for Jesus.
  - ii. In fact, in **Col 4**, *Paul* added to these **two** *commendations* that *Tychicus* was Paul's *fellow bondservant* in the Lord a slave that *chose* to be a *slave*! A *slave* of Christ.
- c. Paul's *point* is clear: the *man* carrying this *letter* to Ephesus was **no** *ordinary courier*! Paul *loved* this guy! ©
- 2. Which brings us to Paul's **two** personal concerns as he closes his letter:
  - a. *First* (21) the *imprisoned apostle* is keen to let the *Ephesians* know how he is *doing*. He can't really put all of that in a *letter*, so *Tychicus* will make *everything* known to you.
  - b. Which leads to Paul's *second* purpose in sending his *friend*. **Comfort!**Tychicus will **not** simply regurgitate an apostolic infomercial his personal presence & report would **comfort & assure** the church that Paul was **standing** firm & **preaching** the truth & was **exactly** where God wanted him to be!
    - i. Don't *lose track* of the fact that *this* is a church that *Paul* had *planted* & then *pastored* for **3** *years*. They *loved* Paul!
    - ii. Don't *overlook* the reality that *Paul's incarceration* was precisely because of his *ministry* to Gentiles churches like  $Ephesus \rightarrow 3:1,2$  (read).

- 3. What can you & I *learn* from these **two** *men*: **one** of whom history *can't* forget & the **other** whom history often *overlooks*?
  - a. We see a little about what it means to *serve* God & *one another*, together.
    - i. Tychicus was humble ("servant," "bondservant" **not** lofty titles). Content to minister **w**/ Paul, **to** Paul, in Paul's spiritual shadow.
    - ii. He was *faithful*. → One of the apostle's *trusted go-to guys* for a *decade*, right up to the *end*!
    - iii. And *Tychicus* was a *comforter*. He *comforted* Paul & he *comforted* the Colossians & *comforted* the Ephesians. **Not** just *anyone* has that *touch*...
  - b. And *Paul* was **more** than a *theological talking head* and he was **not** *overcome* or *absorbed* in his own *difficult* circumstances!
    - i. It's *Paul* that sits in *chains*, but it's his *churches* that he wants *comforted*!
    - ii. It's an attitude that's an echo of what he's already written to the troubled church in Corinth. Turn w/me briefly to 2 Cor 11:22-28 as Paul is forced to defend his ministry to another church he'd planted!
      - 1. Being an apostle was not exactly a cushy job!
      - 2. But don't miss Paul's *heart* in **v.28-29.**
      - 3. Paul loved these *Gentile churches good* churches like *Ephesus* & even *struggling* churches like *Corinth*!
    - iii. And so even in chains his concern was for his friends.

Which is *why* he wrote Ephesians & *why* he entrusted its safe-passage & comforting report to his beloved *Tychicus*.

### And now, we finish Ephesians...

- 1. *Ephesians* is often referred to as one of Paul's *prison letters*, along with *Colossians & Philemon & Philippians*. That's because Paul wrote them all while under *house arrest* in Rome (his **1**<sup>st</sup> Roman *incarceration*).
  - a. Most writers agree that the *big idea* in this *important letter* is "The Church"! ...
    - i. The "Church Universal (Invisible)" every true believer of every generation & every location since Pentecost.
    - ii. The "Local Church (Visible)" specific gatherings of professing Christians, like the Church at Ephesus in the 1<sup>st</sup> century and **BBC** of Sedalia in the 21<sup>st</sup>.
  - b. The **first** *half* of *Ephesians* teaches the *doctrines* of the church & the **second** *half* gives *instructions* about the *daily walk* of the church.
- 2. Now Paul *finishes* his letter with a *benediction & blessing*. It's *personal &* it's *loving*, and just as you'd expect from an apostle, it *teaches* right up to the *very end*! ① In fact, it *reviews* some of the letter's most important *topics*...
- 3. You might say **vv23&24** close w/ **four** *blessings* that God gives the *Church* and her *people*, in Jesus Christ (<u>read</u>); do you *see them:* peace, love, faith, &grace.
  - a. *Peace*. ?Is it possible to have *peace* when you are *in chains* and *waiting* to explain yourself to a *power-crazed lunatic!*?! Paul says *yes!* 
    - i. Christian peace begins with the confidence that your sins are forgiven & your salvation is secure. Elsewhere Paul wrote (Rm 5:1) Therefore, having been justified by faith we have peace w/ God through our Lord Jesus Christ.
    - ii. Peace is fortified by the confidence that God hears & answers your prayers. Listen to what David wrote when he was imprisoned by the Philistines (Psa 56:9): my enemies will turn back in the day when I call; this I know, that God is for me!

- iii. *Peace* is produced by the *Holy Spirit*, who lives in every Christian. In fact, *peace* is one of His *signature fruit* in the life of the *believer*.
- iv. All of which is the realization of Jesus' promise (**Jn 14**) "**Peace** I leave with you; My peace I give to you; **not** as the world gives, do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful."

#### b. Love. Agape love.

- i. *Love* has been a familiar theme in Ephesians: *sacrificial*, *unconditional*, *unselfish*. The *big example* is the cross of Christ!
- ii. Ephesians teaches that *love* is why God saves the *elect*, why Christ *died* for His *church*, how Christians live out the *truth* w/ *one another*, *love* is how *Spirit-filled men* live with their wives, & *love* is what happens as we *serve Christ together* (Paul/Tyc).
- c. *Faith*. Paul pulls *love* & *faith* close together...
  - i. *Faith* is to be **confident** in the *reality* of things you **can't** see & to **entrust** yourself to *promises* that have **yet** to be *realized*.
  - ii. We tend to think that *faith* is something **we** are obligated to *come up with*, when we hear God's *precious gospel promises*.
    - 1. Kind of like standing in front of a *pop machine* on a *sweaty-hot* summer day & *digging* in our *pockets* for a *handful of change...*
    - 2. **But** Ephesians teaches that God gives the *pop* & the *quarters*! For by grace you have been saved through faith...and that not of yourselves, it [→ grace, faith, salvation] is the gift of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast.
    - 3. And here (23) it is clear that the blessing of faith is from God the Father & the Lord Jesus Christ.

- d. *Grace* (24). If you *glance back* at 1:2 you'll be reminded that Paul opened & closed Ephesians w/ grace (& peace)! (Read 1:2)
  - i. *Grace* is God' *favor*, *unearned* **by** us, but *graciously poured out* **on** us by God.
  - ii. *Grace* God giving us the *desire & power* to do His will, *first* in salvation & *then* every day of our lives.
  - iii. Grace is **not** a *magic potion*, **not** a *supernatural energy drink*. It is God working *graciously* **in** us & **through** us. And He *does*!
- 4. In fact, Paul's wonderful *benediction* practically sings "Amazing Grace" as Paul wraps-up by giving God our Father & our Lord Jesus Christ all the glory for all that we have, ... all summed up in these four glorious words:

... peace & love w /faith & grace.

# Peace & love & faith & grace! Amazing! Who gets to <u>live</u> like that!?! Who does God give these to?

- 1. **V.23** answers your question: *the brethren*. That's a **NT** *endearment* for "Christian." → Someone who is born again thru faith in Jesus. Every Christian gets peace & love & faith & grace, day by day!
- 2. And then **v.24** goes on to *immediately identify* the **mark** of a *true Christian*:
  - a. A real Christian **loves** our Lord Jesus Christ w/ love that doesn't corrupt. As in, **love** that is genuine & doesn't wear out or rust out or fade out!
  - b. In a *sense*, Paul is equating *love* to *faith*. Which teaches us that *faith* is much more than simply *agreeing* w/ a *story* & *deciding* to let Jesus save you & *accepting* His *fire insurance policy*. ...pause...
  - c. A Christian loves the Lord Jesus Christ.
    - i. That *full title* simply strengthens the truth that we *love* & *embrace everything* He *is*, ...*did*, ...*taught*, ...*promised*.
- 3. It takes God's *grace* to love like that. And that's *exactly* how Paul finishes! God is in the *grace* business!
- 4. If you *love* Christ, God will empower you to *love* Him even *more*.
- 5. If you *don't*, don't despair! God can give you the **faith/love** to *entrust* yourself to Christ. *Turn* to Him…*believe* in Him…*love* Him!

*Grace* be w/ all those who *love* our Lord Jesus Christ w/ *love* incorruptible.
