HOW TO REPLACE BITTERNESS WITH FORGIVENESS

Ephesians 4:31 – 5:2

Basic rule of relationships: forgiveness and love must go together

I. Put OFF BITTERNESS

6 negatives: A & F are general

A. Bitterness

B. Rage: Blow up

C. Anger: Clam up

D. Brawling: rage in words at the person to hurt

E. Slander: anger in words about the person to hurt

F. Malice: general ill will

II. Put ON LOVE

A & B: what love looks like → C: how to get from bitterness to D: love

- A. Kindness
- B. Compassion
- C. Forgiveness

Defilement covered
Weight lifted
Record erased

Debt paid: release from its bondage

Decision to not hold this against you any more. Costly

D. Love

III. HOW DO YOU DO THAT?

A. MOTIVE: 4:32: "as in Christ God forgave you" 5:2: "just as Christ loved us"

B. MEASURE: 4:32: "just AS" 5:2: "just AS"

How much am I forgiven? How much am I loved? 5:1 dearly loved child

C. FOCUS: 4:32: Christ God 5:1-2: God....Christ...God

D. MECHANISM: 4:31 Lit: "Let it be removed from you..."

That is a passive imperative! Unique

It means you cannot do it! You ask the Lord to take away the bitterness by showing you more of Christ and His sacrifice So 4:30: The Holy Spirit's power in you

Suggestion: go home and write down all the reasons you are bitter against the person who has hurt you. Take that paper outside, read Eph 4:30 to 5:2 and meditate on what that means for you. Then burn the paper as an offering to the Lord. A decision to no longer hold the sins against that person because of Christ. By grace, not because he/she deserves it.

That is not reconciliation. But it is the first step to your being willing to reconcile with them. Whatever their attitude, your heart is **free**.

Memorize these verses in my suggested translation:

Let it be removed from you: all bitterness, rage & anger, brawling & slander, along with every form of malice. Rather be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other as God in/by Christ forgave you. Imitate God, as His beloved children, and walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us...
