"Two Sons – Which Are You?" Galatians 4:21-31

The lesson of the two sons – Isaac and Ishmael
Pointedly addressed to those attracted to the law-keeping teaching of the Judaizers.

1. The Vast Difference between the Two Sons

vv. 21-27

(1) A Difference of Birth and Identity

"For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by a slave woman and one by a free woman.

- Ishmael

"the son of the slave was born according to the flesh"

- Born of Hagar, the slave woman
- Born naturally ("that which is born of the flesh is flesh")
- Isaac

"the son of the free-woman was born through promise."

- Born of Sarah, the free woman
- Born supernaturally through promise; through the Spirit (v. 29)

(2) A Difference of Spiritual Origin and Citizenship (24-27)

- The two women represent two covenants

"Now this may be interpreted allegorically: these two women are two covenants.

One is from Mount Sinai,

Hagar: The covenant in its barest 'law-keeping' feature bearing children for slavery...'

This feature was never intended as a way of justification!

The covenant thus misused and abused bears children for slavery!

Sarah: The covenant of promise The gracious feature and the heart of the covenant

- The two women represent two cities, Two places of origin "Now Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia; she corresponds to the present Jerusalem, for she is in slavery with her children."

Hagar: Mount Sinai and the present Jerusalem

Making law-keeping the means of justification Displacing the ancient gospel promise!

Sarah: the Jerusalem that is above

"But the Jerusalem above is free, and she is our mother."

- -"above" = in heaven, where Christ is
- The spiritual birth place of all true believers, from which they are nourished and governed.
 Phil. 3:20; Heb. 12:22
- Isaiah 54:1 fulfilled in the church!

2. The Inevitable Conflict between the Two Sons

vv. 28-31

"Now you, brothers, like Isaac, are children of promise.

- (1) The Ancient Pattern

 But just as at that time he who was born according to the flesh
 persecuted him who was born according to the Spirit,
 - Ishmael's persecution of Isaac! so also it is now."
 - Gen. 21:8-9 Mocking, taunting; jealous of Isaac's privileges; disturbing the household peace!

(2) Its Present Form

- The Judaizers' persecution of the true children of promise!
 - Sowing discord; disturbing the peace of the church, the household of God!

(3) The Scripture Remedy

"But what does the Scripture say?

'Cast out the slave woman and her son,

- Sarah's words Gen. 21:10 for the son of the slave woman shall not inherit

with the son of the free woman.'

- Approved of by God! Gen. 21:12

"do as (Sarah) tells you, for through Isaac your offspring shall be named."

- Applied here by the Apostle
