## B. What Did Jesus Teach?

1. **The Good News of the Kingdom:** Follow Him (Believe and repent) as King and have eternal life with His Father in His house.
  - Entering the kingdom is \_\_\_\_\_ .
    - Enter as a child (Matthew 18:1-5; Mark 10:15)
    - Enter through faith in Christ's forgiveness:
      - Christ the King has authority to forgive sins (Matthew 9:4-8).
      - He came to reach sinners (9:10-11 (Mk 2:15-17; 5:29-32)
      - His forgiveness is based on His shed blood (Matthew 26:26-35).
      - We need internal cleansing and forgiving even if the outside looks clean (Matthew 15:1-20; Mark 7:1-23; Luke 18:9-17)
      - He forgives the humble person who cries out in faith for forgiveness, not the proud self righteous one (Luke 18:9-17).

- Forgiveness is given to those who turn in faith to Jesus as Savior who died in their place (John 3:1-17).
  - The Father is seeking followers (John 4; Matthew 18:1-35).
- Following the King is \_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 10:1-42; Mark 6:7-13; Luke 9:1-6).
  - He calls us to leave all and follow Him (Matthew 16:13-28; Matthew 4:20)
- Opposing the King is futile:
  - Pharisees will never be forgiven of their blasphemy (Matthew 22-37).
  - Regular debates and confrontation with the Pharisees and religious leaders.
  - Final outspoken, public denunciation of Israel's religious leaders (Climax at Matthew 21-23).
  - Those who reject His rule will perish in eternal Hell (Luke 16).

## **2. The Good News About the King:**

- He is Victor over \_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 4:1-10; 12:29; Mark 1:12-13; Luke 4:1-13).
- He is Lord of the \_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 12:1-12; Mark 2:23-28; Luke 6:1-5; John 5:1-24).
- He is zealous that we worship God properly in spirit and Truth (John 4; Matthew 21:13; Mk 11:15-18).
- He is the fulfillment that Jewish and Gentile people will worship the Lord (Luke 4:16-27; John 4).
- He has authority to forgive sins (see above).
- He is the fulfillment of the \_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 5)
- He has come to die and rise from the dead (Matthew 20:17-19; Multiple in John).
- He will return to judge those who do not follow Him and reward those who follow with an entrance into His Father's home (Matthew 24-25).
- He is preparing a place for His followers in His Father's house (John 14).

- He is the Good \_\_\_\_\_ (John 10) Who gives his life for the sheep and the sheep follow Him, the Bread of Life (John 6) the Door/way to life, and the Light of the world (John 9), the
- He is one with the \_\_\_\_\_ (John 10:22-39)
- He is the Resurrection and Life (John 11:1-39)
- He is the Vine that gives life to those who abide in Him in prayer (John 15).
- He sends the Holy Spirit as our \_\_\_\_\_ (John 14:16-31; 16).

### **3. The Good News about the Followers of the King:**

- They must repent and believe the good news of the King and His Kingdom (Luke 13:1-9; John 3:16-18;
- They must obey from the \_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 5-6).
- They must not be anxious but believing (Matthew 6:25-34; 14:31)
- They must rely on God in \_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 6:1-13; 7:7-11; 17:22; 18:19-22; 21:18-22)
- They must forgive one another (Matthew 18:21-35).
- They must lead by serving one another (Matthew 20:20-28; John 13:12-20).
- They must humbly take the lesser place of honor (Luke 14:7-11).
- They must \_\_\_\_\_ one another (John 13:31-38; 15:12-17)
  - Even those who mistreat them or are not normally considered their neighbor (Matthew 5:43; Luke 10:30-37).
- They must patiently serve Him faithfully until He comes back (Matthew 24; Mark 13; Luke 17:1-37; Luke 21-22).
- They make more followers of Jesus through baptizing and teaching what He commanded (Let's Follow Him! Matthew 28:19-20).
