In response to the declaration that everyone needs to repent some people say something like, "I'm a good person..."

God's Moral Law, the same Law written on Adam's heart, the same Law that, though distorted from sin, is still in Man as part of the Image of God.

Jesus identifies the two parts

To follow Commandments 5-10 is to be moral. No question... but it neglects 1-4 and so violates the entire law.

How can education make someone righteous?

Christian parents may see this:

They raise their children, making mistakes, some serious, giving them a Christian influence. Yet when the children are grown they will have nothing to do with Christ. However, their behavior is conditioned usually from what they learned at home. They may be OK as people but their righteousness is as filthy rags.

Identify the mistakes, if any, made regarding these individuals and the possible response(s)...

There is no one single nor right answer.

- 1) Ned found that his wild ways as a youth could not be sustained as he grew older. As he has gotten older he thought it important to go to church since his parents took him when he was young. So, he is now attending a church.
- 2) Jed was baptized as a child. He doesn't cuss...much. He doesn't steal. He doesn't do those things that offend the people around him (he at least tries not to be offensive.) He prays when he wants God to do something for him. He gives to charity since that reflects the "Heart of The Gospel." He attends church on Easter and Christmas. Some Christians make him nauseated at times because they're always judging others. He feels condemned by one of his coworkers, a Bible-Thumping Christian, by just being around her.
- 3) Fred said the sinner's prayer many times since he was 8 years old and has been baptized twice. He tells everyone that he is a Christian. He tells others that they need to go to church. He feels bad when he argues with his family. He feels that he needs to do something to make his life better. He likes to say the sinners prayer often, especially when he feels bad about himself.
- 4) Ted thinks that his parents' church is boring. So, when he moved out of the house he found one where everybody is friendly, smiling, happy, and he always hears how God

approves of him and wants what's best for him. The worship, he says, "rocks!" He likes the messages because the stories are really interesting and make him feel good emotionally. And, there isn't too much Bible. According to Ted, "there must be balance so that people come back." He's very happy where he is.

- 5) Zed was in a relationship until he felt guilty and broke it off. They were not married. He feels bad when he does something his grandma told him was wrong. She did so back when he was a little boy and when she would speak to him of the Bible many years ago.
- 6) Ed works long hours and has attended church sporadically since he was invited by someone to go to church. He felt that something was missing in his life and so he went to the church. He doesn't attend the church when he is too tired or when something else comes up.
