²³ <u>Whatever you do</u>, work heartily, as for the Lord and <u>not</u> for men, ²⁴ knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ.

Supernatural Love is... (Christ in Us)

- Revealed in our speech (privately & corporately)
- Revealed by were we spend our money
- Revealed by giving our lives as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God!

Is the Love of Christ in Us? Fine Flour (Mixed w/ Oil) & Wine

Romans 12:1–2

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to *present your bodies* as a *living sacrifice*, holy and *acceptable to God*, which is your *spiritual worship*. ² Do not be conformed to this world, but *be transformed by the renewal of your mind*, that by testing you may *discern what is the will of God*, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

Key Idea

Since God has given Jesus for us & to us, we have everything we need to please God.

How does 'Jesus in Us' Work Out in Our Lives

(Answer: Supernatural Love)

Do we "speak" of Jesus with truth and love?

1 Thessalonians 2:4

⁴ but just as we have been approved by God to be *entrusted with the gospel*, so *we speak*, <u>not</u> to please man, but *to please God who tests our hearts*.

Hebrews 13:14-16

¹⁴ For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come. ¹⁵ Through him then *let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise* to God, that is, *the fruit of lips* that *acknowledge his name*. ¹⁶ Do not neglect to *do good and to share what you have*, for *such sacrifices* are *pleasing to God*.

Ephesians 4:15–16

Rather, *speaking the truth in love*, we are to *grow* up in every way into him who is the head, into *Christ*,

from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

"Supernatural forgiveness drives supernatural love." 1

"The Bible assumes that all Christians love one another deeply and sacrificially. It assumes that all Christians assemble regularly with one another. It assumes that all Christians encourage one another to fight for faith. It assumes that all Christians guard one another—through difficult conversations and sometimes through church discipline. In each case, the most basic level of commitment by a Christian to his church is surprisingly substantial." ²

"All Christians are to be meaningfully and self-consciously committed to a particular body of believers, acting as providers rather than as consumers. And this behavior doesn't exist to indicate that they are mature Christians, but that they are Christians." ³

Formal & Informal Commitment 4

- 1. Formal commitment serves as affirmation of informal commitment.
- 2. Formal commitment makes informal commitment visible.

Do We Give Money to Support Gospel Ministry?
