II. Freedom and God's purpose for our body (12-14)

- A. The importance of freedom in the Bible
 - 1. The Jubilee
 - 2. Jesus' mission (Lk 4:18, Jn 8:36)
 - 3. Paul's message (Gal 2:4, Rom 6:14, 7:6, 8:21, Gal 5:13, 4:31-5:1)
- B. 1 Cor 6:12-13 All things are lawful for me .. true, but ... (Rom 6:1)
 - 1. Is the Gospel message antinomian?
 - 2. The Corinthians ignored the balancing truth (Gal 5:13, Rom 6:14)
 - 3. Food and the stomach: a philosophical argument to justify sin
- C. Not all things are helpful sexual sin is <u>harmful</u>
 - 1. The adulteress Proverbs 5:3,4,5,8
 - 2. David and Bathsheba (2 Sam 11:27, 12:10-11,14)

- E. 1 Cor 6:14 the body is not for sexual immorality sexual sin perverts
 - 1. It spoils the *temporal* purpose for which God made the body (1 Th 4:3-5, Rom 8:13)
 - 2. It spoils the *eternal* purpose for which God made the body
 - a. The resurrection demonstrates God's concern for the body

III. Freedom applied to sexual immorality (15-18)

- A. Our bodies are members of Christ
 - 1. Can we take that which is vitally joined to Christ and join with a harlot? ... meh genoito God forbid! Certainly not!
- B. Flee sexual immorality
 - 1. Is sexual immorality worse than other sins?
 - 2. Flee and keep fleeing until the danger is past.
 - 3. The example of Joseph (Gen 39:10,12)
 - 4. We must have a *zero tolerance policy* when it comes to sexual immorality (Eph 5:3)
 - a. Do not allow your eyes to look (Mt 5:28, Job 31:1)
 - b. Do not take a second look
 - c. Beware of charged words (read, spoken, and heard)
 - d. Take care how you dress (Pr 7:10, 11:22)
 - e. Be careful of touching (Pr 7:13)
 - f. Do not look for loopholes "How far is too far?"
 - 5. When you do sin in this area, confess and repent of it and know that you are forgiven *Go and sin no more* (Jn 8:11).

IV. Gospel indicatives motivate you to use your body to glorify God (19-20)

- B. You were bought with a price, so you are now Christ's slave alone
