The Inspired Word Of God

I. In understanding men's devotion to the Word of God we must understand the very nature of the Word of God.

- A. **The Actual Word of God** – In the Bible there are a series of remarkable statements concerning the Word of God. The phrase, “God said” occurs over 570 times; the phrase, ‘Word of Lord’ occurs over 250 times; the Bible refers to itself as the “Word of God” well over 45 time’s.
