The Son of Man Must be Lifted up

John 3:11-15

Introduction

John continues his diligent pursuit of revealing Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God.

- 1) Chapter one was the declaration of His deity.
- 2) Chapter two, the demonstration of His deity.
- 3) Chapter three, the dynamics of His deity (vv1-10).
- 4) Chapter three, the didactics of His deity (vv11-21).

Discourse turns to didactics as Jesus discloses details of divine deliverance from darkness and death by drawing a distinct dichotomy.

To make His point clear to Nicodemus, Jesus raises a sharp dichotomy between *creation* and *heaven*.

"Truly, truly, I say to you"

"we" Gk plural

"you" Gk plural

"we speak...and bear witness..." the second intentionally stronger, more convincing.

His role as Mediator (1:51).

His role as *Healer* (v14)

Not just looking up at the serpent on the pole saved them, but their belief and obedience.

"so must the Son of Man be lifted up"

Ascension and Exaltation.

They must look upon Him whom they have pierced

v15 that whoever <u>believes</u> in him may have <u>eternal life</u>.

Will you entrust your life to Him?

Romans 4:24-25

The crucifixion was a hateful act of man. The resurrection is a loving act of God.

It was not the preaching of the crucifixion that the people loathed, it was the preaching of the *resurrection* that inflamed the murderous hearts of fallen men (Acts 4:2; 23:6-10; 24:21).

Romans 1:4

The crucifixion was the world's darkest hour. The resurrection was heaven's brightest day.

"eternal life"

The all-important dichotomy remains for us:
