## Acts 8:26-39

## PHILIP AND THE ETHIOPIAN EUNUCH

- I. The Ethiopian.
  - A. He is an Ethiopian (descendant of Ham); a man of some authority the treasurer of "Candace" (a title) for the queen.
  - B. He was leaving Jerusalem, where he went "to worship" (27c).
    - 1. He was evidently a proselyte of the Old Testament faith
    - 2. And he had a copy of part of the Old Testament scripture, which he is reading.
  - C. God wanted Philip to work with one soul, so He sent an angel to direct Philip.
    - 1. Philip obeys the heavenly message to go on the desert road not knowing why he was to go there (27a).
    - 2. In God's eyes, this soul is precious and it is the time set in His counsel that this man be given fuller light of the gospel.
- II. Philip sees a group of travelers, and is prompted by the Spirit to join them (29).
  - A. As he goes alongside, hear hears a man reading out loud a passage of Scripture (28).
  - B. The evangelist is given a wonderful opening for the conversation is about Scripture and a great passage: Isaiah 53:7.8.
    - 1. It is a passage about the humiliating suffering of Jesus, made necessary to be the Savior of His people from their sins.
    - 2. Philip preached Jesus (35), not getting side-tracked into non-essential points (easy to do with the prophetic scriptures).
  - C. The Ethiopian was obviously a man of sincere and profound interest in God's Word.
- III. The Ethiopian heard and believed as God worked in his heart the good news of Jesus, the Savior.
  - A. Upon seeing water he asked Philip: What hinders me to be baptized?" (36b).
  - B. The only requirement was whether the Ethiopian believed with all his heart (37a).
  - C. The Ethiopian's simple and complete answer: "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." What marvelous faith!
  - D. Philip recognizes the work of the Spirit and they both walked into the water (not under it).
  - E. And he went his way rejoicing in the God of his salvation (39).
