Isaiah 9:8-10:4

Repeated Refrain

This passage is a poem of four verses with a refrain: "For all this his anger has not turned away, and his hand is stretched out still."

- 1. Read Isaiah 5:24-25. This concluded a section of "woes" for which God would judge the people. What does this refrain mean? How would this sound to the readers?
- 2. According to verse 8, this poem is especially written for whom? Why does Isaiah repeat the refrain four times?

National Pride (8-12)

- 1. Evidently, difficult experiences have already come according to verse 10. How do the people claim to be able to handle adversity?
- 2. What does God have to say about this scorn for setbacks?
- 3. How do we let national or group pride interfere with our relationship with God?
- 4. Do you let arrogant self-sufficiency be your god?

Vacuum of Leadership (13-17)

- 1. What kind of leaders did Israel have? (See also Matt. 23)
- 2. Was all the blame to fall on those leaders?
- 3. What were the main problems in Israel (v. 13, 17)
- 4. How could national pride lead to godless leaders?

Social Anarchy (18-21)

- 1. What does wickedness do in verse 18?
- 2. Is there always a difference between the destruction caused by sin and the destruction brought by the LORD?
- 3. How is this arrogant, godless people treating each other?

Rank Oppression (1-4)

- 1. In this arrogant, godless, selfish society, what happens to the poor and the downtrodden?
- 2. Is it fair that God's anger was yet unabated?
- 3. Read John 3:36. How is the wrath of God abated for us?
