## Armed for Battle Ephesians 6:10-20 (focus on 6:14-17)

## INTRODUCTION

Last time, we began to explore this topic of spiritual warfare and learned that there's a reality...we are engaged in deadly spiritual warfare (we have an enemy, they have tactics, and the battle is up close and personal). We also learned that there's a strategy, namely that we need to be strengthened by the Lord so we can stand strong and stand firm.

So, there's a reality and there's a strategy...for this morning, please note...

What can we say about the armor of God?

A. God's armor is \_\_\_\_\_ in relationship

God's enemy is our enemy. The one who hates God and seeks every moment of the day to usurp God's throne and rob Him of glory is the very one who assaults God's redeemed. The devil knows that he cannot defeat God, so he aims for defeating us. His minions carry out the daily assaults that Paul calls "the schemes of the devil" and "the flaming arrows of the evil one." It's not a matter of if we will be attacked. It's the reality that we live in a fallen world dominated by the demonic as evidenced by the collective rebellion against God in this world. So, we must prepare for daily battle.

The energy, power, and ability to face spiritual conflict are not found in us. It has nothing to do with how spiritually energetic we might be or how many biblical facts we can cite in a game of Bible Trivia. It's not about how great we are at spiritual calisthenics. Instead, spiritual warfare is about relationship to Jesus Christ. Our strength and power for facing temptation and the assault on our assurance is rooted in relationship to Jesus Christ.

While the passive voice of "be strong" implies being strengthened by the Lord and His might—as His activity on our behalf—the next command is in the middle voice. "Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil" (6:11) We see this repeated in verse 13, "take up the full armor of God, so that you will be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm." The middle voice expresses emphatically that you and I take action to put on the whole (it's thorough, complete) armor of God. It is God's armor and it's ready for our use. Spiritual warfare is not about passivity or "let go and let God" kind of thinking. It's about taking action because of Jesus having already acted on your behalf. Find your encouragement to put on the armor of God because Jesus is at work strengthening you with His might.

Since God provides each aspect of our armor, we need not fear its failure against Satan's attacks. Our confidence is not in our abilities, but in the ability of our armor to withstand assault.

Paul details the **six main pieces** of a soldier's equipment—the belt, the breastplate, the boots, the shield, the helmet and the sword, and uses them as pictures of the truth, righteousness, good news of peace, faith, salvation and word of God which equip us in our fight against the powers.
