## V. Conclusion

- Things/people/ideas/attitudes/desires become idols when we give attention and devotion to them which should rightly be directed to God, and the things of God
- When life becomes difficult, we all-too-often turn to these idols for comfort
- 3. We naturally turn to these idols in difficulty because we have been devoting ourselves to them while life is "easy"
- 4. Distress and trouble are designed to make us wholly & ultimately depend on God, and the things of God for our hope and help (2Cor 1:8, 9)
- 5. Instead, our devotion to idols, instead of bringing hope & help, results in hardship and difficulty
- 6. But, as Christians, this kind of hardship is of no real value (1Pet 2:20; 3:14)
- 7. God is the Only One who is worthy of the kind of devotion we lavish on our idols
- 8. God is the Only One who can carry us—why would we devote ourselves to things/people/ideas/attitudes/desires which WE have to carry around?
- 9. Why would we expect hope & help in suffering from a thing/person/idea/attitude which actually is the source of problems (because we worship it)?

Take Home Idea: Useless	is avoided when we devote
ourselves to God instead of idols; and	devotion to God, and not our idols,
enables us to bear suffering.
