## Wisdom, Talent, Luck or Something More?

Ecclesiastes 9:11-18a

- I. <u>HUMAN VARIABLES</u> (11; 2 Chr 32:8)—what we bring to the table
  - A. Our Merits—human effort and abilities that provide advantage
    - 1. Talent—natural aptitude, gifting, innate ability, good genes!
    - 2. Strength—physical strength, manpower, money, technology
    - 3. Wisdom—responsible, prudent, ethical
    - **4. Brilliance**—intelligence, creativity, genius, skill or expertise
    - **5. Education**—well educated, knowledgeable, informed, enlightened
  - B. Our Inadequacy—Human resources, effort, ability not sufficient
- II. <u>DUMB LUCK</u> (11-12)—things *outside* of us that *happen to* us,
  - A. <u>Time</u> (Ps 31:13-15)—progression of events and progress that affect people and things
    - **1. Your Time—**a time that is significant to you, personally
      - a. The Time into which You Were Born
      - b. Your Moment of Fate or Destiny (Jn 2:4; 7:6)
      - c. The Inevitable Day of Your Death (Ps 139:16; Lk 12:25; Jn 7:30)
    - 2. Evil Times (Ps 33:16-19)—distressing period of time, negatively impacts everyone
    - **3. Unexpected Blows** (Ps 112:6-8)—sudden bad news, personal crisis or calamity
  - B. <u>Chance</u>—things just happen
    - 1. Accidental—unintentional, nothing personal
    - **2. Unpredictable**—don't know when, where, or to whom
- III. WISDOM'S GUIDANCE (13-18a)—how to make the best of life
  - A. Wisdom's Value (17-18a)—best thing under the sun we have going
    - 1. Not infallible
    - 2. Better than strength
  - B. Wisdom's Character
    - 1. Wisdom is <u>humble</u>.
      - a. Speaks TO Everyone.

- b. Speaks <u>THROUGH</u> Anyone
- c. Not Personally Ambitions
- **2. Wisdom is <u>quiet</u>**. (Isa 42:2-3; Prov 1:20–21 & 25:15; Mat 11:29; 1 Pet 3:4)—Manner demonstrates confidence
  - a. Manner—calm, composed, gentle—not loud and tyrannical
  - b. Attitude—confident, self-assured
- **B.** <u>Wisdom's Requirements</u> (Isa 30:21)—You are responsible
  - 1. You must choose to listen. (Pro 4:1)
  - 2. You must choose to act. (Js 1:22)
- IV. GOD'S HELP (Prov 21:31; Ps 16:8)—What makes all the difference!
  - A. <u>God's Sovereignty</u>—His choice, design and purpose
    - 1. My Personal Composition (Ps 139:13-14)
    - 2. My Time in History (Est 4:14)
    - 3. My Place in Geography (Act 17:26)
    - **4. My Purpose in Life** (Ps 139:8)
  - B. <u>God's Power</u> (1 Sam 17:47; 2 Chr 32:8; 1 Cor 1:25; 2 Cor 12:9)—available to me
    - 1. His Wisdom
    - 2. His Strength
    - 3. His Resources
  - **C.** <u>God's Favor</u> (2 Chr 25:8; 1 Cor 1:26-31; 2 Cor 12:9)—our confidence & comfort. We have nothing to fear!
    - 1. His plans are good. (Jer 29:11)
    - **2. His promises** are sure. (1 Kin 8:56; Ps 145:13; Rom 4:21)
    - 3. His attention is guaranteed. (Ps 33:18-19; Isa 64:4)
    - **4.** He can handle anything that comes! (Ps 16:8; 18:29; 27:3; Jer 20:11; Zec 4:6)
