## The Definition of Saving Faith (5)

Intro: Abram, the father of all believers (Gen. 15:6; Romans 4:17-25)

A. Saving faith is an exercise of trust rather than an experience

## THE RECEIVING OF JESUS CHRIST John 1:12 & Col. 2:6

- A. His own did not receive Him (John 1:11)
- B. Yet a number did receive Him (John 1:12-13)
  - 1. John 1:13: the source of their faith
  - 2. John 1:12: the act of their faith: they received Jesus Christ the Lord
- C. What is receiving Jesus Christ?
  - 1. It is an act of faith whereby we respond positively to His offered grace
  - 2. To receive Him is we take Him and embrace Him & His Gospel message a. a receiving heart accepts all His teaching as true
    - b. a receiving heart declares its willingness to have Him as their Savior
    - c. a receiving heart submits to Him as their Lord
  - 3. To receive Him is like the bride's "Yes, I will" to her proposing husband
  - 4. To receive Him is "embracing Jesus Christ with all His merits, appropriating Him and seeking nothing more besides Him." (Conf art 22)

- D. To receive Him is followed with a believing on His Name
  - 1. Greek to receive is verb form that reflects a 'moment in the past'
  - 2. Greek to believe is a verb form that is a 'continued action'
    - a. the best evidence of faith begun is faith continuing
- E. What are the blessings of this receiving Jesus Christ?
  - 1. "... to them gave he power to becomes the sons of God"
    - a. power: right or privilege belonging to adoption (Col. 2:10, 11, 13-14)
