- What are the reasons Paul gives for our vigilance regarding them and our turning away them?
- What positive state does Paul find the Roman Christians in?
- Even though they were in a good and healthy place, what does Paul want for them as they continue their Christians walk?
- Community Group Discussion: There may be a difference between "the teaching" the first readers of Paul's letter had "learned" (17) by the time of Paul's letter and "the teaching" we have learned to this point in our lives. What might those differences be and how does that impact how we should practically heed Paul's exhortations to "keep our eye on" and "turn from" those who cause dissensions and hindrances contrary...?
