Jesus gives us 4 sources of happiness... money, food, positivity and being liked.

And basically says happy are those who don't have them.

We <u>care so much</u> about what everyone <u>thinks</u> about us. We want to be <u>popular</u> and <u>loved</u>.

But Jesus says...

4. Happy are the Hated

²² "Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you and revile you and spurn your name as evil, on account of the Son of Man!

In the <u>Old Testament</u>, the <u>true prophets</u> of God were <u>hated</u>. People <u>liked</u> the prophets who told them what they <u>wanted</u> to <u>hear</u>. Who <u>scratched</u> their <u>itching</u> <u>ears</u>. Who prophesied <u>lies</u> in order to <u>make</u> the people <u>happy</u>.

But the <u>true</u> prophets were <u>fiercely persecuted</u>.

1 Kings 18:17-18 - [Ahab said to Elijah,] "Is that you, O troubler of Israel?"

Elijah was proceeded by **Elisha** who was persecuted even by children. They yelled out...

2 Kings 2:23 - "Get out of here, baldy!"

Jeremiah the Prophet was

Jeremiah 20:2 beaten and put in the stocks

Jeremiah 20:7, Jeremiah said... I am ridiculed all day long; everyone mocks me.

In the <u>popularity contest</u> of life, **Jeremiah** came in <u>last place</u>.

He was a hated man, **but** he was loved, treasured and valued by **God**.

Blessed are you when people hate you

People don't want the truth. They want to feel good.

Isaiah 30:10

"Give us no more visions of what is right!

Tell us pleasant things,

We don't want to hear the truth. Tell us nice things.

There is a lot of **pressure** in this life to <u>say</u> thing things that will <u>make everyone happy</u>. To tell people what they <u>want to hear</u>.

Then, they'll <u>like you</u>. Then, they'll say good things about you. **Everyone loves** the <u>positive</u>, <u>funny guy</u>. But Jesus says...

²⁶ "Woe to you, when all people speak well of you, for so their fathers did to the false prophets."

William Hendriksen comments on this passage: When all men speak well of you, there must be something wrong with you. You are not taking a stand for the truth. You are not being a blessing. And you are digging your own grave.

<u>Israel loved the false prophets</u>. The false prophets got invited to all the <u>parties</u>.

They <u>wouldn't</u> speak out <u>against the sin</u> of the people. Rather, they'd <u>participate</u> in the sin and make the people <u>feel comfortable</u>...feel <u>normal</u>...feel like they were <u>decent people</u>.

The false prophets of **our day**...

- They won't speak out against <u>homosexuality</u> or <u>abortion</u>.
- They won't tell children to obey their parents.
- They won't tell wives to submit to their husbands.
- They won't speak out against the <u>trans-gender</u> movement. --- **Matthew 19:4** <u>Jesus</u> **said**, "In the beginning, he made them male and female." --- Jesus made it very clear; there are only 2 genders, male and female.

But... No one wants to hear that. We just want <u>nice stories</u>. We want to *leave church* <u>feeling</u> <u>good</u> about ourselves.

Brad Paisley sings

He yelled out from the back row "Look here preacher man, We all know you're new here but you need to understand...

So tell us bout them angels and how they fly around and sing Don't talk about sin and judgment and hell.

Keep it nice and pretty, preacher, and we just <u>might come back</u> next week.

Tell us bout them angels!

But on **judgment day**, I would **NOT** want to be the guy with the <u>biggest church</u> or the <u>most friends</u>.

I wouldn't want to be the guy that everyone likes.

No. I want to be the man is who <u>honored by God</u>. The one who has a <u>place</u> at <u>God's table</u>. That's the <u>party</u> that I want to get <u>invited</u> to.

Jesus said it this way...

²² "Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you and revile you and spurn your name as evil, on account of the Son of Man! ²³ Rejoice in that day, and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven; for so their fathers did to the prophets.

So... Maybe you don't get all the goodies in this life.

- Maybe you don't have a lot of money.
- Maybe you end up hungry ... or eat terrible food.
- Maybe you're SAD... a lot! (like the Prophet Jeremiah)
- Maybe people don't like you.

The **Apostle Paul** was <u>hated</u> by so many people. He was <u>beaten</u> and <u>stoned</u>. He was <u>run out of town</u> on many occasions.

But his life was good. Really good!

His life was better than yours.

He was <u>happier</u> than you.

He gave his all for the **kingdom** of God, and it was totally worth it.

Paul said in Acts 20:24 in his final words to the elders of the Ephesian church

I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself, if only I may finish my course...

Paul spent his life for Jesus Christ.

He spent many long, <u>hard years</u> in <u>poverty</u>. Many years with people <u>hating</u> him.

And, at the end of his life, he has no regrets. He's happy! It was totally worth it!

He <u>never</u> had a <u>mid-life crisis</u> and bought a <u>Porsche</u>. He gave <u>his all</u> for the kingdom of God. And he <u>looked back</u> on his life, and he described it in <u>2 words</u>: **WORTH IT!**

Philippians 3:7-9

⁷ But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸ Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in him...

Why would Paul put himself through all this?

For the surpassing worth of knowing Christ!

<u>Poor</u>, persecuted, <u>despised</u> and rejected. Eating <u>terrible food</u> or <u>not eating</u> at all.

And at the end, he was happy with his life!

Jim Elliot said it this way:

"He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain that which he cannot lose."
